

The Immigrant Integration Index is a numerical representation of where New York State communities lie on the integration spectrum which produces a score card that assigns a grade to capture the performance of regions and communities in comparison with other regions and communities in our state.



The Immigrant Integration Index is the culmination of extensive research by the Center for Women in Government & Civil Society, Rockefeller College of Public Affairs & Policy, University at Albany and supported by the NYS Assembly that quantifies at what point an immigrant integrates into our society.



To compute this factor, massive amounts of data were collected to divide New York State into 10 Regions and 145 Census Specific Sectors with very precise information on immigrants versus native born to determine:

- What are the moderating effects of **nativity status**, race and gender on socio-economic outcomes of foreign-born New Yorkers?
- What are the moderating effects of **limited English proficiency and low educational attainment** on socio-economic outcomes of foreign-born New Yorkers?


