NEW YORK STATE PASSES ANTI CHILD-LURING BILL

ALBANY- Assemblyman Joseph Saladino passed his anti child-luring bill to keep the most dangerous sex offenders behind bars. Saladino hailed the legislation as a landmark for public safety and children's welfare.

"This legislation will help protect our communities and neighborhoods. I am very happy to have helped pass this important law to keep dangerous predators where they belong... BEHIND BARS," said Assemblyman Saladino.

- Increase prison sentences for sex predators including 25 years to life for child rapists and mandatory life without parole for repeat violent felony sex offenders
- Provide secure facilities for dangerous sexual predators with mental abnormalities
- Give judges the discretion to keep these predators confined
- Toughen penalties to keep sexual predators locked up longer
- Establish a state Office of Sex Offender Management to track sexual predators, help victims, and protect the public
- Require lifetime parole supervision when violent felony offenders are released from prison
- Create the felony crime of Luring a Child, punishable by up to 15 years imprisonment

Assemblyman Joseph Saladino Passed A Stronger DNA Database Law

Assemblyman Saladino fought for and passed an expanded DNA database law which has been working to find, catch and convict far more criminals including sex offenders. Under this law, DNA samples are collected from all convicted felons. At the same time, this system goes a long way to help innocent people who have been wrongly arrested or convicted.

This expanded DNA database is the first of its kind in the nation, and Assemblyman Saladino is proud to be keeping you and our communities safe as he played a significant part in passing this law.
