ASSEMBLYMAN JOSEPH SALADINO leads efforts to clean up the Grumman Navy plume and our drinking water

- ◆ Saladino passed law A. 9492 mandating the DEC create a plan reporting the best method to hydraulically contain and remediate the entire plume of toxins.
- ◆ He petitioned the NYS DEC and enlisted Governor Cuomo's help, forcing the Navy to turn over its water samples, proving the identity of the responsible parties required to pay remediation costs.
- ◆ Saladino pressured the NYS DEC to order that the Navy begin remediation of the most concentrated hot-spots of TCE and PCE (known carcinogens) in the plume.
- ◆ Created the directive signed by almost all of the Members of the NYS Assembly to clarify the priority of protecting the drinking water wells in Massapequa and Farmingdale and protect our wetlands and the Great South Bay.
