




As we begin a new school year, Chad Lupinacci is working hard to ensure that the education of Long Island's next generation remains top notch. As a former school board member, he understands the importance of hearing from everyone involved in our children's lives, from teachers to parents, while also balancing the cost to taxpayers. That's why Chad has been:

- **Organizing a grassroots movement that helped secure over \$2.5 billion in funding for Long Island schools, including more than \$121 million in new funding;**
- **Supporting the Next Generation NY Job Linkage program, preparing students for real-world jobs; and**
- **Fighting to make sure personal information about our students remains confidential.**

As the ranking minority member on the Assembly's Higher Education committee, he also knows we need to do more to make sure our children can grow up and find jobs in the communities we know and love. He's put forward an aggressive agenda that includes:

- **Ensuring affordable education for all by establishing the affordable college education scholarship program to allow eligible resident students to earn a bachelor's degree at a cost no greater than \$10,000;**
- **Encouraging students to stay local after college through the "Retain-NY" program, by providing a tax credit for college-educated residents who remain in the State after graduation; and**
- **Continuing the fight for Long Island's fair share of state education aid.**
