Success for our families in the 2013-14 budget

Enhanced Education for our children:

- Nearly \$1 billion increase in public school aid from last year providing over \$5 million more than the Governor's proposal to the 21st Assembly District, with the help of Senator Skelos;
- \$136.7 million provided to non-public schools; an increase of \$13.9 million;
- \$85.6 million in library aid funding – supporting community-based institutions for learning – an increase of \$4 million from last year;
- Nearly \$650 million in Community College base aid for state-operated schools - providing high-quality, affordable education to our young adults.

Support the cost of living for our families:

Facing more expensive costs every day, from groceries to gas to utilities, our families needed just a little help to put dinner on the table and make their loved ones feel more secure in New York State.

Families with at least one child, up to the age of 17, who make between \$40,000 and \$300,000 annually will be receiving a \$350 check in October 2014.

Although making living in New York more affordable is still on the agenda, this measure will help provide our children and families a little help while we continue the hard work of bringing tax relief to all New Yorkers.
