



**2014-15 School Aid = \$9,415,236**

**Difference From 2011-14: Increase of 31 percent.**

Within this same period, we significantly increased state aid to non-public and private schools each year.

In this year's state budget, I fought for and voted to provide an additional \$602.1 million to offset the education cuts of 2010 and 2011, otherwise known as the Gap Elimination Adjustment (GEA). While it is not enough to completely end the cuts, we are on the right track; and next year will provide another opportunity to end the GEA, something I have continually advocated for. This budget also increases library aid to \$86.6 million, \$1 million more than last year.

Fighting for our fair share of state educational aid is not the only important issue facing our kids. After hosting over a dozen public forums and hearing from thousands of concerned parents and education professionals from across the state, the Assembly Minority Conference and I proposed the APPLE Plan to reform Common Core and education policy in New York. Legislative leaders made minor reforms to Common Core in this budget, but it's not enough. As a father and advocate for education, I will continue to push for a complete overhaul of Common Core and other necessary education reforms.
