


It's a new session and it's time to finally clean up Albany!

Assemblyman Brian Curran is the Ranking Minority Member on the Assembly Ethics Committee. His Ethics Reform package includes:

- Term limits for all elected officials;
- Losing taxpayer-funded pensions for violating the public's trust;
- Increasing criminal penalties for public bribery, misuse and theft of taxpayer funds;
- Pass the Public Officers Accountability Act (A7393), the strongest anti-corruption legislation in the nation, that would ban individuals convicted of felonies related to official duties from future public employment, lobbying activity or bidding on state contracts; and require that the campaign funds of public officials convicted of a felony are returned to donors or turned over to charity, and more; and
- Saying 'NO' to any campaign finance plan that will use taxpayer dollars to benefit politicians and fund their campaigns so they can get elected. Don't be fooled: A public campaign finance system will lead to more corruption — not less. That money should go to educate our children, programs and services for seniors, mandate relief, and/or property tax relief.

Holding public office is a privilege and honor. It's time we hold public officials accountable for their actions. The people of New York deserve better and should be able to trust the representatives they have sent to Albany to represent them.
