About Virtual VITA tax preparation

You:

- Bring your tax documents. *See the back for a checklist.*
- Speak with the on-site tax professional if you have questions.
- Leave the site and go about your day.
- Go back to the site OR provide authorization by phone.

Your return:

- The on-site tax professional scans and uploads your documents using a secure website.
- An IRS-certified tax preparer reviews the documents and prepares your return.
- The preparer calls you to confirm information.
- After you sign or authorize the return by phone, the preparer electronically files the return.
- You get a paper copy if you returned to the site or an electronic copy by email.

Tax documents to bring to VITA site:

- Proof of identity (e.g., driver's license or other photo ID)
- Social Security cards for self, spouse, and dependents and/or Social Security number (SSN) verification letters from Social Security Administration OR Individual Taxpayer Identification Number (ITIN) letters (original or copies)
- Forms W-2, W-2G, 1099-R (wage and earning statements)
- Forms 1098, 1099 (interest and dividend statements)
- Form 1095-A, if you purchased health coverage through the Health Insurance Marketplace
- Proof of health coverage exemption granted by the Marketplace, if applicable
- Copy of your 2013 federal and state returns, if available
- Proof of any other income, e.g., lottery winnings
- Total paid for child care provider and provider's Taxpayer Identification Number or SSN
(for NYC Child Care Tax Credit)
- Bank account and routing numbers (to request direct deposit of refund)

For Married Filing Jointly returns, you and your spouse must be present to sign required forms.
