Hepatitis C**



Hepatitis C is known as a “silent killer”

Assemblyman Walter T. Mosley helped pass a law requiring hospitals to offer Hepatitis C testing to patients born between 1945 and 1965 (Ch. 425 of 2013).

-  According to the NYS Department of Health, as many as 150,000 New Yorkers are unaware they are infected with Hepatitis C.
-  75% of infections occur within adults born between 1945 and 1965.¹
-  Chronic Hepatitis C can lead to liver problems, including cancer.
-  The good news is that, if caught early enough, Hepatitis C is treatable.
