ASSEMBLYMAN NICK PERRY WORKING TO KEEP OUR STREETS SAFE



While some are talking about sitting down and discussing violence on our streets, Assemblyman Perry is working with colleagues who are serious about taking real action to make our neighborhoods safer and take our streets back.

- **Co-Sponsored and passed in Assembly landmark micro-stamping legislation**
Microstamping technology imprints a tiny code (or “microstamp”) on the shell casings that are ejected from the gun every time a bullet is fired. It’s a simple technology that would help police link shootings to guns -- and to criminals. According to statistics, if police find one microstamped shell casing at a crime scene, they have a 54% chance of identifying the gun. Right now, using existing ballistics technology, they have a 2% chance.
- **Author and Sponsor of “New York’s Chance to Help Act”**
Legislation would require police to notify a parent or responsible adult when a youth up to age 18 comes in contact with law enforcement for violating any law. This law provides a chance to help, by alerting a responsible adult before a minor is allowed to continue down the wrong path, committing additional offenses, ultimately more serious in nature, and resulting in arrest and arraignment.
- **Secured funding for NY Youth Works Program**
Provides \$62 million for job training and \$25 million in tax credits to combat high unemployment among inner-city youth. High unemployment is one of the known contributing factors to crime and violence in our streets. By working with the governor to secure funding for this program, Assemblyman Perry has adopted a proactive effort to attack the crime problem at its root.
