**Holding the MTA accountable.** Titone voted against the payroll tax last year and is pushing for a law to require that all schools, including Catholic and private schools, be reimbursed for the MTA payroll tax (A.8726). He is also working to prevent the Triborough Bridge and Tunnel Authority from raising tolls to fund MTA projects (A.3970), ensuring that our underserved area is not funding the agency’s operations in other parts of the state.
