In 2010, Albany dysfunction was at its worst:

Since 2011, Assemblywoman Malliotakis has successfully:

TRANSPORTATION

Residents saw fares increase while MTA bus and subway service decreased.

Increased transportation funding and restored service on B8, B37, B64, S93 and X27.

BUDGET

The state had a \$13.5 billion deficit after adopting late budgets riddled with waste.

Funding for senior centers, education and programs was threatened.

Passed four on-time budgets by capping spending and cutting taxes, creating a \$2 billion surplus.

Increased funding for education and Universal Pre-K, senior citizen programs for prescription drugs, rent exemption and access-a-ride.

TAXES

Taxpayers continued to be nickel-and-dimed with tax increases on clothing, bottled water and utility bills.

The STAR rebate was eliminated.

Delivered tax relief to families by restoring tax exemption on clothing under \$110, reducing hidden energy tax in utility bills and reinstating STAR property tax benefits.

ECONOMY

Failing economy stifled possibility for job creation.

Worked to improve economic climate and attract business by eliminating the manufacturing tax and reducing MTA payroll tax and corporate income tax.

CRIME

Mandatory minimum prison sentences for lower-level drug felons were repealed.

Criminal records for felony drug offenders could be sealed.

Expanded DNA database and enacted tough gun control legislation.

Established life without parole for killing a first responder.

Adopted 11 new laws to combat heroin epidemic.
