OTHER BUDGET SUCCESSES:

- ✓ Successfully defeated the Dream Act, a measure to provide illegal immigrants with taxpayer-funded tuition aid; and
- ✓ Commitment to move forward with stripping pensions from elected officials convicted of public corruption.

IVOTED FOR:

- ✓ Increased funding for MTA bus and train service;
- ✓ Increased funding for Tuition Assistance Program to help disabled students pay for higher education;
- ✓ Establishing opioid overdose prevention education program in schools;
- ✓ Increased funding for homeland security;
- ✓ Investments in disaster preparedness and emergency management;
- ✓ Increased funding for veteran counseling services;
- ✓ Increased funding for our public libraries; and
- ✓ Funding for Universal Pre-K.

- X Tax credits for millionaires, billionaires, and Hollywood, while middle-class families continue to struggle;
- X Empowering the State Education Department and Board of Regents, which are both responsible for the disastrous roll-out of Common Core, to develop a new teacher evaluation process;
- X Allowing high-stakes testing to be used as a major component of teacher evaluation; and
