As a volunteer, you may qualify for additional benefits and services, including:

- **NYS Volunteer Firefighter Real Property Tax Credit**
- **Length of Service Award Program**
- **College Tuition Reimbursement**
- **Participation in Municipal Health Insurance Plans**
- **Partial and Total Disability Benefits**

Honoring Our Heroes:



OPPORTUNITIES FOR YOU

Education: Veterans Tuition Award

This program provides full tuition or \$5,895 (*whichever is less*) to NYS veterans pursuing their undergraduate or graduate degrees at any NYS college or university. Some vocational programs also qualify. Most NYS veterans who served in overseas combat since 1961 and were honorably discharged qualify.

Jobs:

- **One-Stop Career Centers:** these statewide centers offer priority service to veterans on a variety of topics including:
 - Career counseling
 - Skills assessment
 - Job search assistance
 - Resume preparation
 - Information on civil service positions
 - Referrals to other agencies that provide veterans assistance
 - Access and assistance with the US Department of Labor's Veterans' Employment and Training Services
- **Veterans Job Bank:** an online job bank for veterans powered by the National Resource Directory.

Homes: Homes for Veterans Program

This program provides fixed-rate mortgages at 0.5% below existing rates as well as \$3,000 toward closing costs (or 3% of your requested loan, whichever is less). Through this program, the minimum borrower cash needed is only 1%. Veterans do not need to be a first-time homebuyer to qualify.

Tax Relief: NYS Veterans' Property Tax Exemptions

There are three different exemptions to provide veterans with additional tax relief, in addition to existing STAR or Enhanced STAR for Seniors exemptions. Exemptions are not automatic, so please be sure to discuss them with your assessor.

Long Term Care: NYS Veterans Nursing Homes

Our area's closest veterans nursing home, Oxford, provides veterans with skilled nursing care and rehabilitative services.

Women Veterans Specific Support:

Hunting Licenses & Fishing Permits:

NYS offers free or reduced rates for active members of NYARNG, US Reserves or active military and disabled veterans, including small and big game hunting licenses, trapping, and fishing permits.
