

**SCHODACK:  
Hudson River Islands State  
Park**  
Hudson River Islands State Park facilities are concentrated on the islands of Gay's Point and Stockport Middle Ground. These islands are fragile communities with many rare and endangered plant and animal species. Day-use facilities include picnic areas with grills and nature trails.

**Schodack Island State Park**  
Schodack Island State Park sits off the eastern shore of the Hudson River just south of Albany. Approximately seven miles of Hudson River and Schodack Creek shoreline bound the 1,052 acre site. A day-use facility, the park has been designated a State estuary, and a portion of the park shelters a Bird Conservation area which is home to bald eagles, cerulean warblers and blue herons that nest in the cottonwood trees. Eight miles of multi-use trails wind through a variety of ecological communities. One Schodack Island Way, Schodack Landing, NY 12156. Call 732-0187 for more information.
