The forum will provide an overview of the Medicare program and coverage options.

In addition, they will discuss the EPIC program which assists over 310,000 income-eligible seniors ages 65 and older in supplementing their out-of-pocket Medicare Part D drug plan costs.

Home Health Care Ruling

Both federal and state government has not been able to support the providers to the level they need in order to make salary commensurate with service. This decision, although some may think is a major victory, needs action by the state to keep agencies afloat. We need to be able to pay a meaningful wage for employees in the field to provide quality care to our patients.

Expect this to be on the agenda this budget season.
