





Making **life** more **AFFORDABLE**

Anthony Brindisi:

- Cut income taxes for middle-class families to the lowest rates in 58 years
- Eliminated the state sales tax on clothing and shoes under \$110
- Shifted burdensome Medicaid costs off counties, providing relief through a phased in state takeover

Keeping our **families** **SAFE**

Anthony worked to:

- Create I-STOP, the first real-time prescription-drug database in the country, allowing doctors to track and fight against prescription drug abuse (A.10623)
- Give NY the most expansive DNA databank in the nation (Ch. 19 of 2012)
- Reform New York's care of people with special needs and disabilities (A.10721)

Anthony helped:

- Allocate \$5 million for military base retention efforts and another \$600,000 for military base redevelopment
- Author the law to restore essential tax credits so **F.X. Matt** can continue to grow and thrive
- Increase aid to community colleges by \$150 per-FTE student - the first increase in 5 years - meaning an additional \$850,000 in aid for MVCC

Addressing **local** **ISSUES**

Getting us **back** **TO WORK**

Anthony fought to:

- Invest \$7.5 million in Mohawk Valley infrastructure through the NY Works program
- Expand current net-metering law to help qualified farms that generate their own power to save on electric costs (Ch. 318 of 2012)
- Award SUNYIT \$500,000 for additional staff to aid in the development of science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) fields
- Create a veterans' job bank to help returning veterans find employment (A.8932-A)

Anthony worked to:

- Pass an on-time budget that closed a \$3 billion deficit without raising taxes
- Include \$220 million for the next round of Regional Economic Development grants
- Direct \$430,000 toward the local share of recovery costs for Hurricane Irene cleanup
