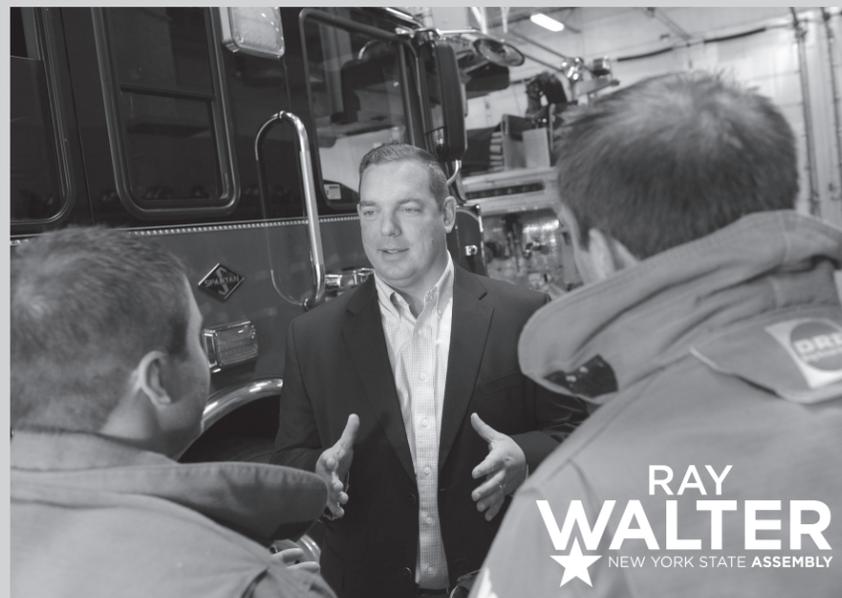


VOLUNTEER FIREFIGHTERS AND EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICE PROVIDERS
