

## Summer Safety Tips

Assemblywoman Melissa "Missy" Miller wants to help make sure your pets have a happy and healthy summer vacation too. Here are a few tips to keep your pets safe during the hot summer months:

- Make sure your pets stay hydrated and look out for signs of overheating. Symptoms include: vomiting, wobbly legs, dry or bright red gums, diarrhea, thick drool and heavy panting.
- It is dangerous to leave your pets in the car, even if the windows are cracked, for just a few minutes.
- Test hot pavement before taking your pets on a walk. If you can't hold your hand on it for at least five seconds then it isn't safe for your pets' paws.
- Animals can get sunburn just like humans.
  Apply sunscreen to your pets' most exposed areas such as their noses, ears and bellies.
- Shaving your pets to "keep them cool" actually puts them at greater risk for sunburn and overheating. Their fur is designed to protect and keep them cool.

#### **Prepare Before Disaster Strikes**

- In case of an emergency, place a pet alert sticker on your doors to inform others of the number and type of pets inside your home. This is especially important to have in case you aren't home. You can get these stickers online or at your local pet store.
- Pack a week's worth of food, a copy of vaccination or medical records, their medication, a crate/carrier, and if you have one, information on your pet insurance policy. Having a picture of your pets and some of their favorite toys is handy too in case you get separated.
