### Hurricane Ida Resiliency with Mayor Adams

Last September 1st, Hurricane Ida devastated our city. Communities throughout Queens were particularly hard hit, and 13 of our neighbors died as a result of the storm. With the enormous threats of climate change growing, we must be better prepared for these super storms. I joined Mayor Eric Adams, Department of Environmental Protection Queens Borough President Donovan Richards, City Council Speaker Adrienne Adams, City Council Members Joanne Ariola and Bob Holden, and Assembly Member Nily Rozic for a briefing by Chief Climate Officer Rit Aggarwala from the New York City Department of Environmental Protection. Together we mourned the lives lost and committed our efforts to resiliency and flood mitigation systems, including the 2,300 new Rain Gardens that have been installed across the city. These Rain Gardens can collect over 600 gallons of rain per hour, making them an important part of our resiliency efforts.

#### **Happy Chanukah!**


