Fighting for Better Bus Service & Emergency Meeting on the MTA

On Tuesday, I joined with Assemblymember Jeff Dinowitz, the Chair of the Assembly's Committe on Corporations, Authorities and Commissions to call on the MTA to provide better bus service.



Along with many of my colleagues from the legislature I signed on to a letter which asks for the MTA to produce a comprehensive plan to improve bus service within six months. We will not be able to fix our current transit crisis without modernizing our NYC bus service. Simple changes like transit signal priority and all-door boarding technology, as well as new more efficient routes would make for faster and more reliable bus service for all New Yorkers. Too often, New Yorkers are forced to choose an inconvenient subway route for their commute over what should be a more convenient bus route, because of unreliable and slow bus service. Addressing these problems is critical to alleviating the congestion in the subway system and is vital to solving our overriding transit crisis.

After the press event, I attended a special conference with the Assembly Majority to discuss the MTA, its various troubles and possible solutions to fix those problems. After a presentation by the MTA on its subway action plan as well as presentation's by advocacy groups, it's clear that there is no magic bullet. Included among the ideas that should be seriously discussed to fix the MTA are congestion pricing, surcharges on Uber and Lyft etc., and a management restructuring so that the MTA is not the most expensive mass transit system worldwide by a factor of four.

Flatbush Stands Together - Hate Has No Place Here

Kensington Fitness

We started to hear from constituents about the sudden closure of Kensington Fitness, a fitness club located at 202 Caton Avenue on Monday. The gym was seized by the City Marshal due to lack of rent payment. A number of constituents have said that they paid membership dues as much as a year in advance to the gym and would like to get their money back. Our office has been in touch with the NY State Attorney General's Office to alert them about this situation.
