Dear Friends and Neighbors,

The City's primary election is on Tuesday, June 22 with an early voting period from Saturday, June 12 to Sunday, June 20. We are proud to have helped to secure additional poll sites at The Met and on Roosevelt Island at Sportspark gym. Voters are assigned to Early Voting and Election Day poll sites so check the 'find my poll site' website before you head out to vote.

Our legislation to require those convicted of hate crimes to complete antihate training has passed Assembly, and gained Senator Toby Stavisky as Senate sponsor. We look forward to pushing for the passage of this critical legislation to promote tolerance in our communities.

As Chair of the Task Force on Women's Issues, I was proud to pass a resolution proclaiming Domestic Awareness Month to be October 2021 in New York State. Every minute 24 people are victims of rape, physical violence or stalking by an intimate partner in the United States. Survivors of the violence will experience health and mental health related consequences. New York state has been a leader in supporting survivors. The Office of Children and Family services reported that over 53,000 survivors of Domestic Violence and their children received housing supports. Providing funding and social supports to survivors and children prevent adverse outcomes like chronic disease, substance use, dropping out of school, and employment and relationship challenges. There is still work to do. By proclaiming October to be Domestic Violence Awareness Month, we are amplifying the voices of survivors to help those who are still struggling today, and making the public aware of the resources available to aid victims.

The New York State Clinical Advisory Task Force approved the use of the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine for 12 - 15-year-olds. This approval allows New York State to begin administering the vaccine to this newly eligible age group starting today. All New York State vaccination sites are open for walk-in appointments to all eligible individuals. You can also make an appointment online through the Am I Eligible tool or by calling 1-833-NYS-4-VAX (1-833-697-4829).

Assembly Member Rebecca Seawright announced that The Met Fifth Avenue will be open to voters between Saturday, June 12 and Sunday, June 20 for early voting and on Election Day, June 22. Seawright's office led a sign-on letter to The Met and the Board of Elections to request the additional site after witnessing the overcrowded Wagner School during last fall's General Election. Seawright also announced a Roosevelt Island early voting site this week.




