Local Funding Secured in the State Budget

- St. Nicholas Chess for Kids, Inc \$10,000 Funds will provide materials and supplies to run an after-school chess program for local youth.
- Education Through Music \$150,000 Funds will be used to provide music instruction for children in our local public schools.
- East 233rd Street Senior Center \$10,000 Financial assistance will provide materials for senior programs and activities.

Speaker Heastie Invests in our Community's Seniors

Seniors play a vital role in our community and supporting them through funding programs designed to enrich their day to day is important. Senior programs provide a space for seniors to connect with their peers while fostering muchneeded social interaction and activity. These programs provide not only social activities, but also prioritize the health and wellness of our most vulnerable through programing and nutrition.

- Bay Eden Senior Center \$30,000 Funding will provide for materials and supplies for the senior program.
- RAIN Inc. \$100,000 Funding will provide programming at senior centers throughout the Northeast Bronx.

Investment in Food Programs Provides Increased Stability for Families

In this year's state budget, Speaker Heastie made significant investments in food assistance programs to ensure families in need receive nutritious food items. Food insecurity programs are vital to our community and address the humanitarian needs of our neighbors. Nutritious meals provide families with greater health and well-being, as well as better education and economic outcomes.

- Grow NYC \$250,000 Funds will go toward programming and support for Grow NYC sites in our local communities. Grow NYC makes fresh, affordable produce accessible to underserved communities across NYC.
- St. Luke's Community Food Program \$25,000 Funds will go toward programming and support for Grow NYC sites in our local communities. Grow NYC makes fresh affordable produce accessible to underserved communities across NYC.
- ICNA Relief USA \$25,000 Funds will alleviate human suffering by providing caring and compassionate service to victims of adversities and survivors of disasters.

Bill to Create the New York State Community Commission on Reparations Remedies Passes the Legislature

The Assembly passed legislation to create the New York State Community Commission on Reparations Remedies to examine the impact of slavery, discrimination and

systemic racism against African Americans, and to propose appropriate remedies. (A.7691, Solages).

Speaker Heastie said, "The institution of slavery in our state and nation laid the groundwork for the racial, economic and institutional injustices that have plagued communities for decades. This is a historic piece of legislation that will confront the insidious history of slavery and the way its legacy continues to affect Black New Yorkers today."

The legislation would establish the New York State Community Commission on Reparations Remedies to examine the institution of slavery, de jure and de facto racial and economic discrimination against people of African descent, and the impact of these forces on living African Americans. The commission would be tasked with making determinations regarding appropriate remedies and reparations, as well as examining potential policy and legislative solutions for damages done to people and communities.

To know our future, we must know our past.

Assemblyman Heastie Allocates \$60,000 in Funds to Local Libraries

Assemblyman Carl Heastie has dedicated funding to purchase materials and supplies for local libraries. Our libraries play a crucial role in communities everywhere, providing invaluable resources that promote the progression of knowledge and culture.

"Members of the community, especially our youth, rely on libraries for not only books but access to the information highway - the internet. Thanks to the New York Public Library, there is always an opportunity to expand your horizons and open your mind to a book, as well as close the ever-growing technological gap," said Assemblyman Carl E. Heastie.

Speaker Heastie Awards Local Schools Funding for Needed Updates

In the fall, Speaker Heastie toured local public schools to assess their needs and find ways to best assist students and families. Following these tours, Speaker Heastie has allotted over \$3 million in state funding for these schools to update infrastructure and begin various projects. Projects include: HVAC repair, school gymnasium updates, creation of science labs, technology updates, afterschool programming, agriculture instruction, music programming, air-conditioning units, STEM programs, auditorium equipment, water fountains, washer/dryer systems, extracurricular activities, and so much more.

"Our children deserve the best education possible, regardless of their zip code," said Speaker Heastie. "Public schools are the backbone of our community, training the minds of tomorrow. We must continue to work to give these institutions the best equipment, the best supplies, and the best environment to ensure they can provide our children with the best education."

Speaker Heastie Secures \$75,000 to **Fund the Bridgefield Civic League**

Assemblyman Carl Heastie has nominated Bridgefield Civic League to receive funding to help in the continued renovation and upkeep of the facility and the ongoing education and service programs conducted by the League. The funding will assist in the renovation and needed repairs to the building. Additionally, the funding will help the Bridgefield Civic League provide education services, mentoring, and career training to the local community.

Assemblyman Heastie Secures \$50,000 for NAACP's Williamsbridge Branch

The Williamsbridge branch of the NAACP will be able to conduct education and afterschool programing for local families with funding secured by Assemblyman Carl Heastie through the state Education Department. This program helps children achieve academically through education and mentoring from older students and adults.

Speaker Heastie Delivers \$365,000 for the Mind-Builders Creative Arts Center

Speaker Heastie helped secure \$365,000 in this year's state budget for the Mind-Builders Creative Arts Center. The program offers children enrichment and instruction in music, dance, theatre and other arts programs. Funds will be used to purchase materials and supplies for continued program operation in our community.

Education in the arts has been shown to offer numerous benefits, including bolstering creativity and expression, increasing critical thinking and problem solving, and fostering emotional intelligence in both children and adults.

This program offers an opportunity for young adults to have hands-on experience with shared cultural arts and activities. The programs are conducted year-round to help keep young adults off the street and engaged in quality cultural enrichment.



Speaker Heastie Secures \$75,000 for the **Bronx Bethany Community Corporation**

The Bronx Bethany Community Corporation will be receiving \$75,000 in state funds as the result of Assemblyman Heastie's advocacy. The funds will be used to allow local children to enjoy summer day camp and other resources.

Speaker Heastie Secures \$30,000 for the Northeast Bronx Day Care Center

Assemblyman Heastie has reallocated \$30,000 in funding for the Northeast Bronx Day Care Center (formerly known as the Susan Wagner Day Care) to purchase materials, services and supplies. The facility, located at 4102 White Plains Rd., will allow local youth to enjoy a safe, educational and clean play experience.

Speaker Heastie Secures Funding for Cameras for Local Police

Community safety continues to be a top priority for residents of the Northeast Bronx, and investments in technology will play a great part in bolstering security. Argus Cameras, also known as 'eyes in sky,' enhance the capabilities of local police departments, enhancing surveillance and deterring crime. Speaker Heastie secured \$450,000 for the 47th and 49th NYPD Precincts to purchase and install these cameras throughout the 83rd Assembly District.

Speaker Heastie Secures Funding for Northeast Bronx YMCA

The YMCA of Greater New York was awarded \$5 million to support the operation of community centers across New York City, including our very own Northeast Bronx YMCA. This funding will enable the Y to continue to service local communities through time-tested programs, such as After School for Youth, summer camp, teen center activities, older adult programming, adult literacy programs and food pantries. As you know, the YMCA does not turn anyone away due to inability to pay and this funding helps to maintain the Y's ability to serve in this way.

This recreation center is a historic asset to the community that promotes better health maintenance and social opportunities for the young and elderly alike. It provides children and families with a place to learn and grow in a healthy environment. This facility, located at 1250 E. 229th St., also provides space for recreational use and social gatherings in the Northeast Bronx. Since its opening, the Northeast Bronx YMCA is now home to over 3,000 members.

Another \$150,000 was awarded to the Northeast Bronx YMCA to provide second grade swimming lessons to local schools. With water-related accidents at an all-time high nationwide, it is of the upmost importance to provide children with necessary lessons to ensure they can swim and be safe when around pools. The YMCA provides swimming lessons for adolescents as well as for adults.

With summer now in full swing, many children are out of school and require summer enrichment to continue learning in preparation for the new school year. With the assistance of Assemblyman Carl Heastie, *many students will be attending the Northeast Bronx YMCA summer camp at no or low cost to families, due to an additional \$150,000 grant he worked tirelessly to secure.*
