

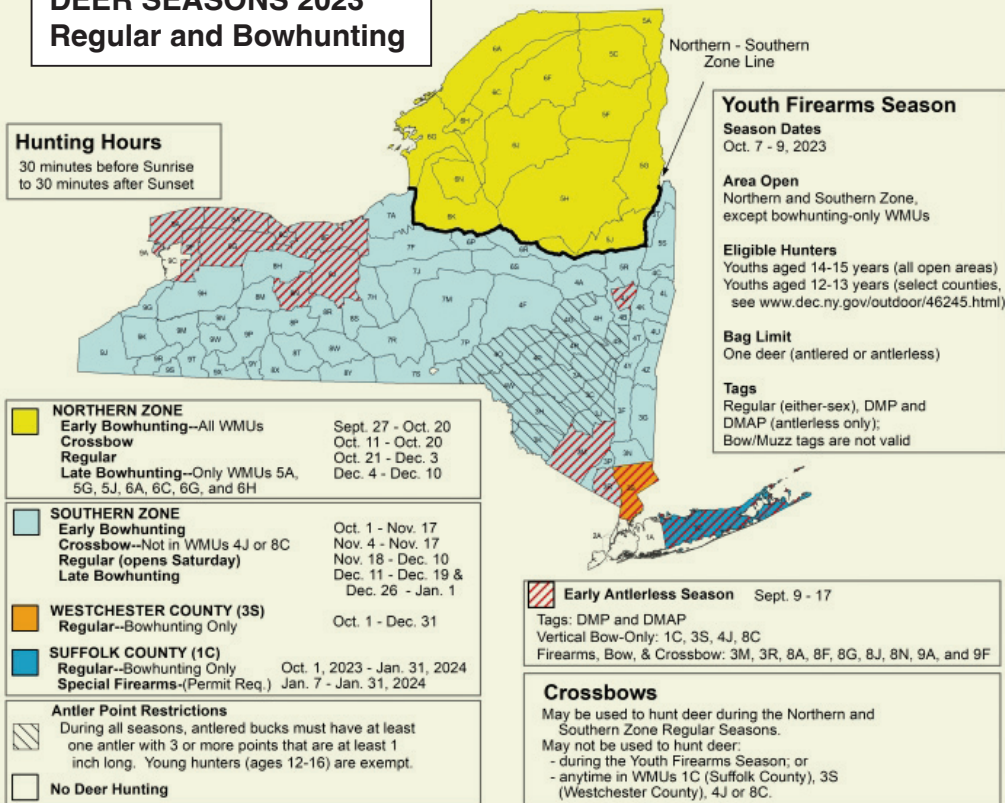

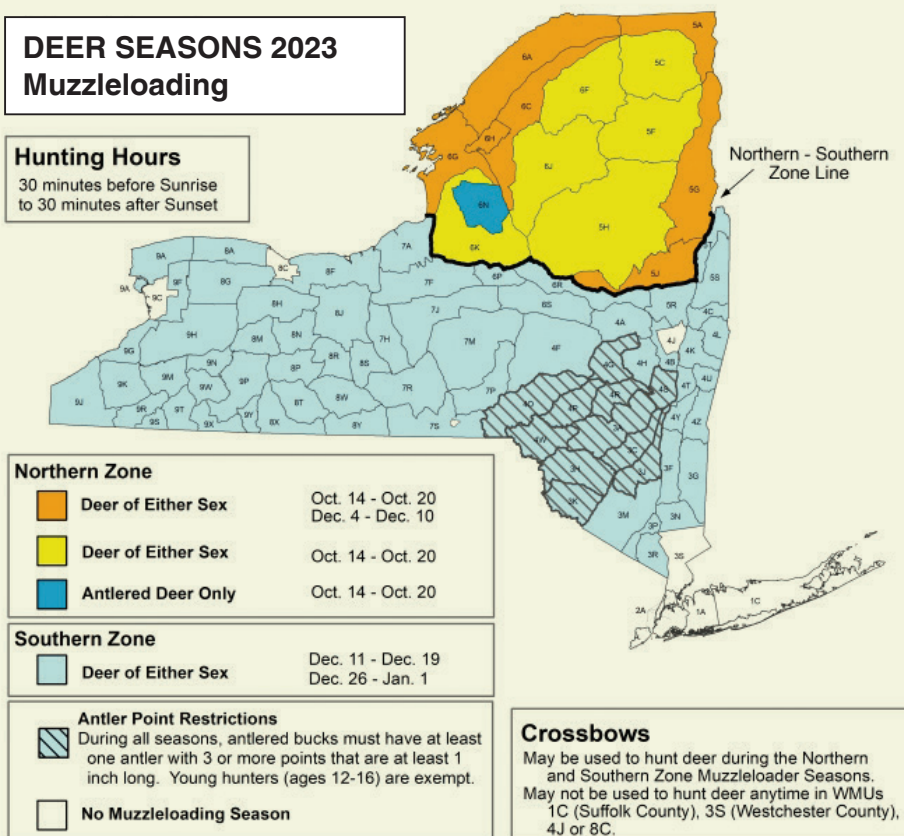

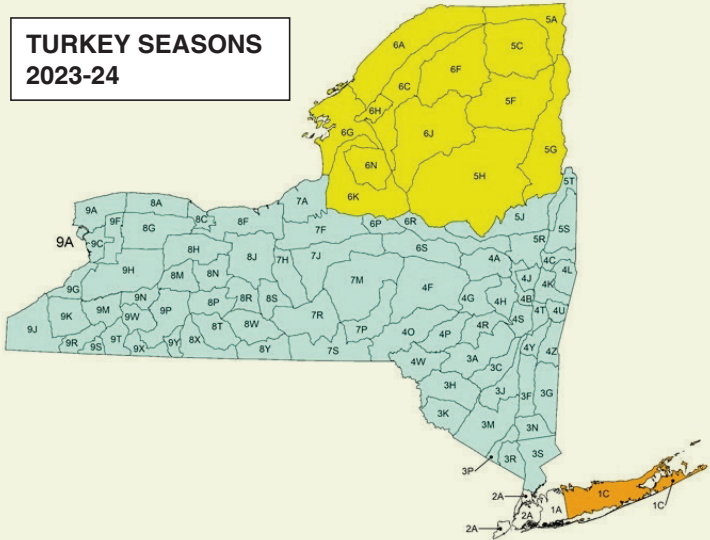
DEER SEASONS 2023 Muzzleloading

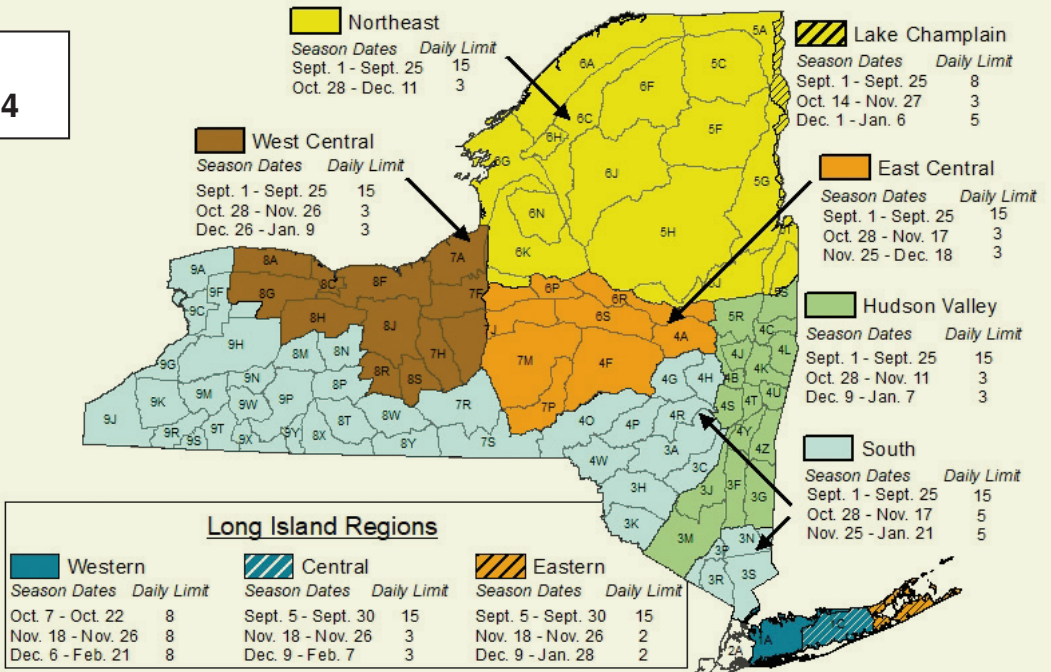

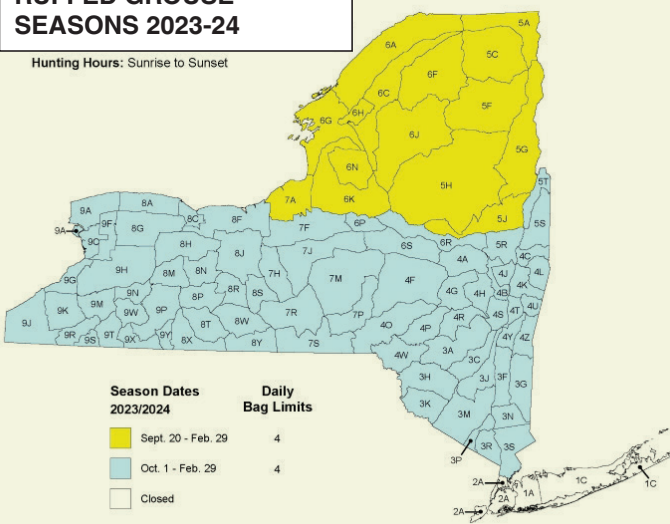

Hunting Hours: 1/2 hour before Sunrise to Noon	
Season Dates:	Statewide Bag
May 1 - May 31	2 bearded birds, daily limit of 1, and no more than 1 may be harvested in WMU 1C
in all open areas

Youth Turkey Season 2024	
Hunting Hours: 1/2 hour before Sunrise to Noon	
Statewide Bag Limit: 1 bearded bird	
Season Dates: April 20 and 21, 2024	
Open Areas: Same as Regular Spring Season	

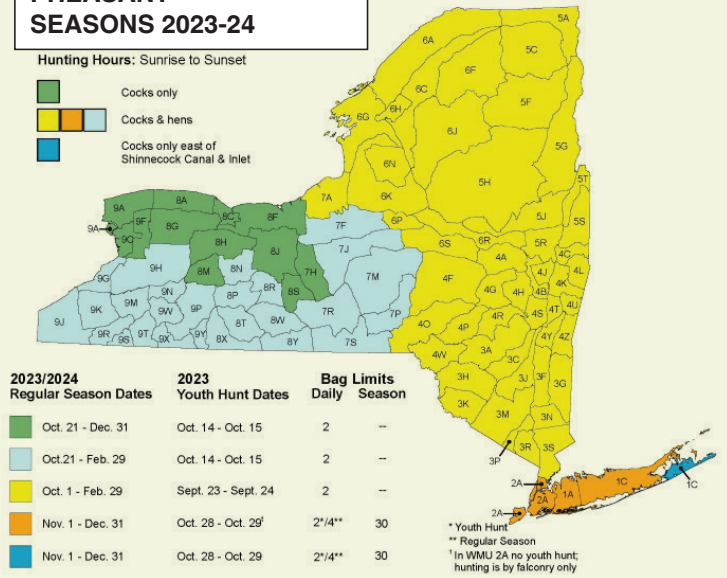
CANADA GOOSE SEASONS 2023-24



RUFFED GROUSE SEASONS 2023-24



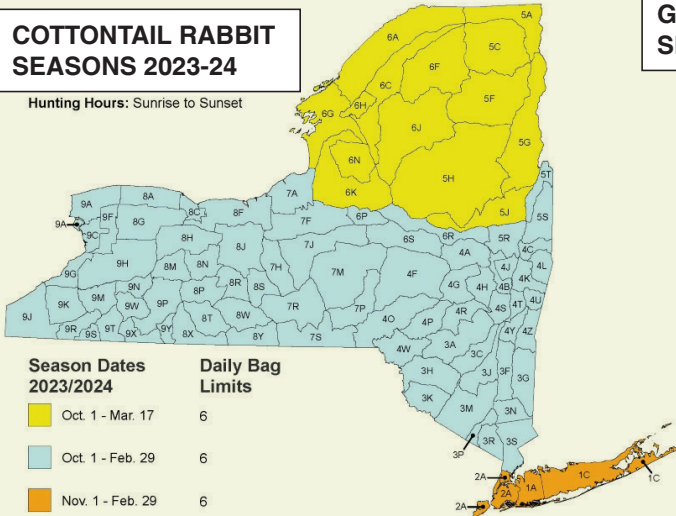
PHEASANT SEASONS 2023-24

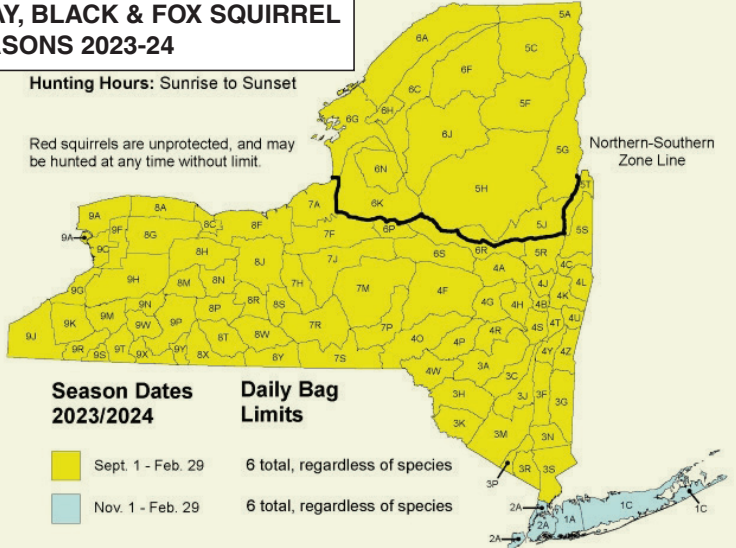

GRAY, BLACK & FOX SQUIRREL SEASONS 2023-24

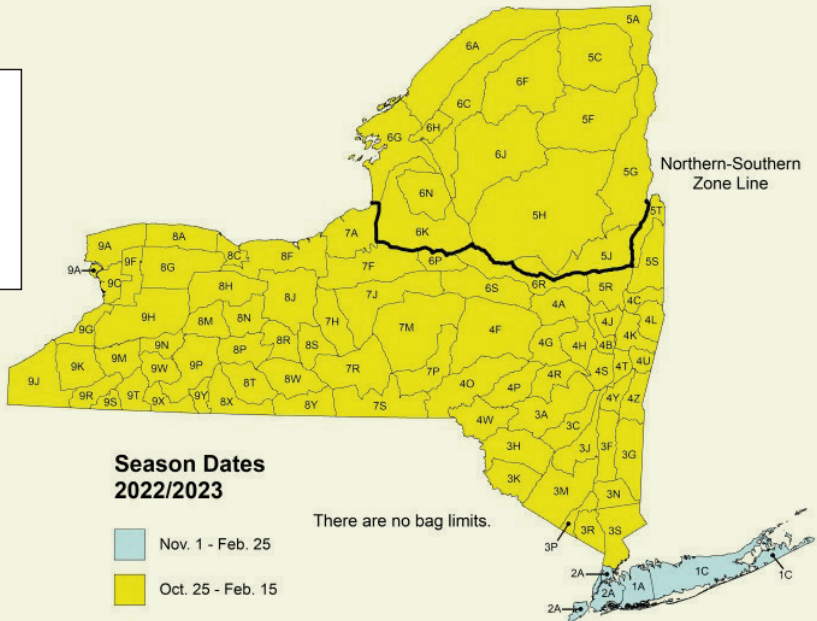
Hunting Hours: Sunrise to Sunset

Red squirrels are unprotected, and may be hunted at any time without limit.



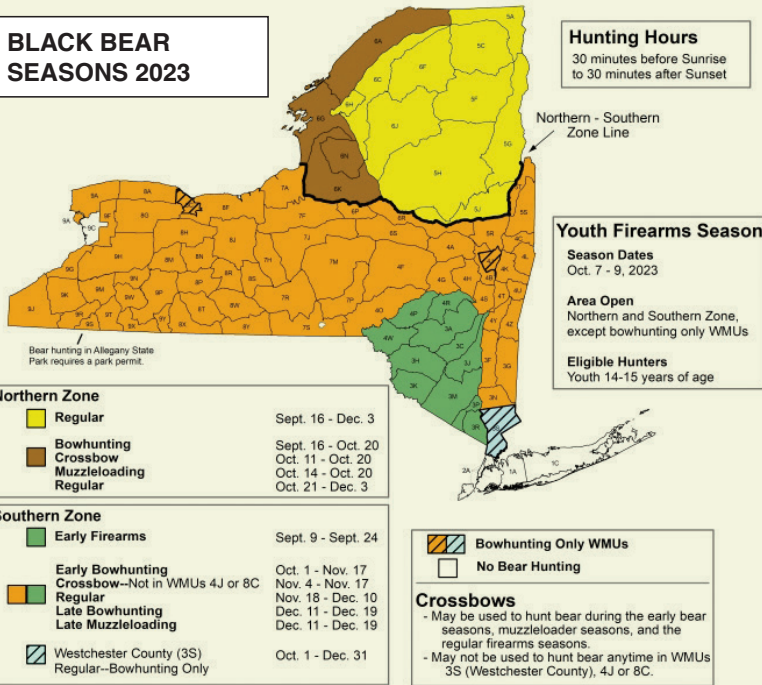
RACCOON RED & GRAY FOX SKUNK OPOSSUM WEASEL SEASONS 2023-24

After sunrise on opening day; and at any hour, day or night, for the rest of the open hunting season. Weasel may only be hunted from sunrise to sunset.



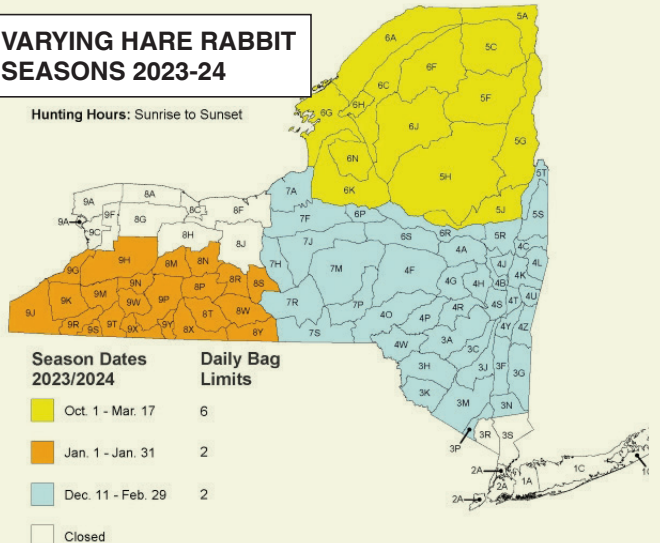
BLACK BEAR SEASONS 2023

DON'T FORGET

The four rules of firearm safety: **1.** Keep the muzzle pointed in a safe direction at all times; **2.** Treat every firearm as loaded; **3.** Be sure of the surroundings in front and behind the target; **4.** Keep your finger off and outside the trigger guard until ready to shoot!
