## **Don't Lose Your BASIC STAR Exemption**

One-time re-registration is needed before December 31

If you are a homeowner who currently receives a Basic STAR exemption on property taxes, re-registration is required by December 31. Registration can be done online at <u>www.tax.ny.gov</u> or by calling (518) 457-2036. If you have any questions about the registration process, contact the NYS Department of Taxation and Finance at (518) 457-2036.

Assemblyman Magnarelli took part in the ribbon cutting of the historic preservation of Kasson Place and Hillside/West Park Apartments on Oct. 28. The Kasson Place development of 83 units in two buildings furthers the growth and revitalization of the James Street corridor. The Hillside and West Park Apartments will serve low-income families. Between the two buildings there will be 17 studios, 38 one -bedroom units and 35 two -bedroom apartments. The redevelopment of these buildings will help revitalize core neighborhoods in the City of Syracuse. This revitalization has provided over \$9,500,000 of construction improvements to provide 90 new homes for working families in the City of Syracuse.
