Mike Norris has been working hard for us by supporting legislation that will improve the lives of senior citizens all across New York State:

- Mike helped create a new law to protect seniors from identity theft by adding the crime to the definition of elder abuse and exploitation (Chapter 655 of 2021). He supported legislation to investigate fees and charges for residents of assisted living facilities (A.4275 of 2020).
- Mike voted to create a task force to ensure the state better meets the long-term care needs of New York's elderly citizens (Chapter 758 of 2021).
- Mike has fought hard against Albany's "tax-and-spend" culture especially during these times of skyrocketing inflation in order to further protect seniors' valuable savings. He sponsors legislation to reduce the cost of household essentials for everyone (A.1690 of 2023).
- Mike knows that after a lifetime of hard work, there's nothing more you'd like than to enjoy your home and community. To combat the high taxation that forces too many seniors out of their homes, Mike is sponsoring legislation to allow more seniors to qualify for the Enhanced STAR property tax exemption (A.2769).

## **HELPFUL RESOURCES:**

The Elderly Pharmaceutical Insurance Coverage (EPIC) program is a New York State program for seniors administered by the Department of Health. It helps more than 325,000 income-eligible seniors aged 65 and older to supplement their out-of-pocket Medicare Part D drug plan costs. Seniors can apply for EPIC at any time of the year and must be enrolled in or eligible for a Medicare Part D drug plan to receive EPIC benefits and maintain coverage.

## **Enhanced STAR:**

Enhanced STAR provides an increased benefit for the primary residences of senior citizens (age 65 and older) with qualifying incomes. The STAR benefit applies only to school district taxes. It doesn't apply to county, town, or city taxes, except in the cities of New York, Buffalo, Rochester, Yonkers, and Syracuse. Senior citizens receiving STAR may also be eligible for the senior

## HEAP:

The Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) can help eligible New Yorkers heat and cool their homes. If you are eligible, you may receive one regular

HEAP benefit per program year and could also be eligible for emergency HEAP benefits if you are in danger of running out of fuel or having your utility service shut off.
