Legislative Reductions

The Legislature reduces Non-personal Service funding by \$99,000 associated with the Agency's anticipated move to the Alfred E. Smith building.

Article VII

The Legislature denies the Executive's Article VII proposal to abolish the State Liquor Authority (SLA) and transfer its functions to the Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC).

The Legislature approves the Executive's proposal to authorize the ABC to increase most new filing fees for alcoholic beverage licenses and permits to reflect State administrative costs.

The Legislature rejects the Executive's proposal to allow for the direct shipment of wine into New York State from out of state wineries, after receiving a license and with the payment of appropriate taxes.

Legislative Additions

The Legislature provides \$225,000 in additional funding to restore the State Liquor Authority as a separate entity. The Legislature also provides \$136,000 in additional funding to prevent closure of ABC's Syracuse office.

The Legislature provides a \$2,000,000 appropriation to allow for the expenditure of funds collected pursuant to a settlement related to violations of the Banking Law by certain regulated institutions.

Article VII

The Legislature amends the Executive's Article VII proposal to authorize the Superintendent of the Banking Department to establish assessments, fees and penalties by regulation. This proposal was modified to authorize the Superintendent of the Banking Department to establish a single billing process for assessments and fees, while providing the Superintendent flexibility in the timing of such billing.

The Legislature also clarifies references to entities regulated by the Banking Department for the purposes of the general assessment, and specifies the Superintendent's authority to take action against institutions which fail to comply.

Additionally, the Legislature defines the supervisory powers of the Superintendent to apply to outof-state institutions with branches in New York State as well as bank holding companies, and expands the prohibition against unsound practices.

In addition, the Legislature adds language that requires a report to the Governor and the Legislature on January 15, 2005 on the policies, activities and expenditures of the Holocaust Claims Processing Office and the overseas offices in London and Tokyo.

The Legislature denies an Executive proposal to allow for the Division of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) to "host" certain administrative functions of the Capital Defender Office (CDO). The Legislature restores \$89,000 to allow for the CDO to continue to perform its own administrative duties.

Legislative Changes

The Executive vetoed the following portions of non-appropriation budget bills passed by both houses of the Legislature. The Legislature does not believe such Executive veto actions to be consistent with the New York State Constitution.

- To ensure that \$89,000 restored by the Legislature to the CDO is utilized to support personal and non-personal service associated with the administration of the Office. This provision requires that these administrative duties shall not be transferred to any other state office, division or agency (Veto #199).

Article VII

Due to enactment of Chapter 417 of the Laws of 2004, the Legislature denies the Executive's Article VII proposal to increase the penalty for violations of New York State's No Telemarketing Sales Call Law to conform with the Federal penalty. Chapter 417 provides for the same increases in penalties as the Executive's Article VII proposal.

The Legislature denies the Executive's Article VII proposal to increase the maximum civil penalty for unfair and deceptive business practices and false advertising from \$500 to \$5,000.

The Legislature approves the Executive's Article VII proposal to authorize the Consumer Protection Board to recover costs incurred while investigating complaints pertaining to the Motor Fuel Practices Act.

The Legislature provides for additional appropriations of: \$12,000,000 to deny the Executive's prison closure proposal and provide for continued operations of Camp Pharsalia Correctional Facility, Camp Mt. McGregor Correctional Facility and Fulton Correctional Facility; \$300,000 to deny the Executive's closure proposal and provide for continued operations of the Watertown Special Housing Unit (SHU); and \$7,000,000 for an increase in correctional officer and correctional sergeant positions at correctional facilities to increase the number of security relief positions and reduce overtime costs.

Article VII

The Legislature extends for one year a provision which directs the Commissioner of the Department of Correctional Services (DOCS) to provide a report containing an array of detailed information related to the staffing of correctional facilities.

The Legislature denies an Executive Article VII proposal to merge the Crime Victims Board (CVB) into the Division of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS). As a result, the Legislature restores \$501,000 to meet costs associated with the administration of the CVB. The Legislature returns all crime victims services funding back to CVB.

Article VII

The Legislature accepts an Executive Article VII proposal to require the payment of mandatory surcharges and a crime victims assistance fee for adjudicated Youthful Offenders, and includes a provision to waive certain fees for indigent persons.

The Legislature rejects the following Executive Article VII proposals:

Merge the Crime Victims Board into the Division of Criminal Justice Services;

Establish a \$25,000 cap on medical payments to crime victims and a \$60,000 cap on payments for catastrophic injuries to crime victims; and

Authorize mandatory surcharges and a crime victims assistance fee to be imposed in cases where the defendant paid restitution in full.

LEGISLATIVE ACTION

The Legislature augments the Executive proposal by providing for an additional \$4,734,000 in General Fund support for local criminal justice initiatives (Westchester County Policing: \$2,600,000; Indigent Parolee Representation Program: \$580,000; Road to Recovery Program: \$500,000; Education Assistance Corporation: \$450,000; Lifespan Elder Abuse Prevention Project: \$300,000; Law Enforcement Training and Technological Enhancements: \$170,000 and the New York Prosecutor's Training Institute: \$134,000). The Legislature increases by \$1,000,000 the amount of funds available to support the Motor Vehicle Theft and Insurance Fraud Prevention grant program. The Legislature further provides \$50,000 for a study on the impact of stun guns and other non-lethal weapons used by law enforcement.

Legislative Reductions

The Legislature denies an Executive proposal to merge the Crime Victims Board into the Division of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS). As a result, the Executive recommendation for DCJS is reduced by \$69,253,000 (\$3,425,000 in General Fund appropriations; \$38,380,000 in Special Revenue – Federal appropriations; and, \$27,448,000 in Special Revenue – Other appropriations). The Legislature simultaneously restored distinct appropriations for the operation of an independent Crime Victims Board.

The Legislature denies an Executive proposal to shift all Probation Aid and Alternatives to Incarceration (ATI) funding from the Division of Probation and Correctional Alternatives (DPCA) to DCJS. As a result, the Executive recommendation for General Fund spending in DCJS is reduced by \$70,854,0000. The Legislature simultaneously restored this same level of funding to DPCA, to allow continued administration of such funding.

The Legislature denies an Executive proposal to shift the administration of the Indigent Legal Services Fund from the Office of the State Comptroller (Department of Audit and Control) to DCJS. As a result, the Executive recommendation for DCJS is reduced by \$12,000,000 (Special Revenue – Other) and enacted appropriation for the Department of Audit and Control are increased by \$12,000,000.

The Legislature denies a \$5,000,000 appropriation to support a program for the prosecution of a greater volume of Vehicle and Traffic Law offenses. Instead, the Legislature restores funding for the Division of State Police (\$3,000,000) to continue its assisting role in the adjudication of certain traffic violations.

Article VII

The Legislature accepts Executive Article VII legislation that establishes a new \$1,000 fee to be paid by convicted sex offenders.

The Legislature accepts an Executive Article VII proposal to require the payment of mandatory surcharges and a crime victims assistance fee for adjudicated Youthful Offenders, and includes a provision to waive certain fees for indigent persons.

The Legislature accepts with modification an Executive proposal that would redirect fine revenue remitted upon conviction of certain Vehicle and Traffic Law violations where speeding was the initially-charged offense. The Legislature amended the Executive proposal to allow for localities to assess a \$10 surcharge on certain violations of Vehicle and Traffic Law committed between September 1, 2004 and September 1, 2005.

The Legislature accepts a provision that would accelerate partial reimbursement to the Office of Court Administration and localities for the provision of indigent legal services, to allow for both entities to receive payment at the end of the present fiscal year. The Legislature denies Executive proposals to allow for DCJS to administer the Indigent Legal Services Fund and also rejects a proposal to enact a rigid formula to distribute Fund resources.

The Legislature rejects the following Executive Article VII proposals:

Merge the Crime Victims Board into the Division of Criminal Justice Services;

Expand a mandatory \$15 parking ticket surcharge to all vicinities of the State; and

Authorize the Division of Criminal Justice Services to implement automated photo-monitoring at highway work zones.

The Executive vetoed the following portions of non-appropriation budget bills passed by both houses of the Legislature. The Legislature does not believe such Executive veto actions to be consistent with the New York State Constitution.

-To direct DCJS to use \$50,000 appropriated by the Legislature to conduct a study on the impact of non-lethal weapons utilized by law enforcement (Veto #198).

-To direct a portion of Federal funding to be made available to support anti-terrorism initiatives enacted through Chapter 1 of the Laws of 2004. Specifically, the Legislature directs \$2,000,000 to improve security at various airports throughout the State, and further directs additional Federal funds to support a statewide chemical security assessment and Hazardous Materials (HAZMAT) training for first responders (Veto #200).

Legislative Reductions

The Legislature denies the Executive's request for \$1,126,000 in General Fund appropriation to offset an anticipated loss of Park Avenue Armory rental income in SFY 2004-05.

Legislative Changes

The Legislature restores \$1,280,000 for the Special Revenue Armory Rental Account due to the continued receipt of Park Avenue Armory rental income.

Article VII

The Legislature denies the Executive's Article VII proposal to increase fees paid by nuclear generating facility operators.

The Executive's Article VII proposal to provide for an increase in the minimum daily rate of pay for New York National Guard members on State active duty was subsequently approved by the Legislature [Governor's program bill # 95 (A.11697 and S.7607)] and therefore was not included in the enacted 2004-05 State Budget.

The Legislature provides authorization for the transfer of the Culver Road Armory to the City of Rochester upon the Division of Military and Naval Affairs (DMNA) determination that such property is no longer needed for use by the organized militia.

Supplemental Municipal Aid

The Legislature appropriates \$183,574,002 in Supplemental Municipal Aid, an increase of \$700,000 from the Executive budget submission. This increase extends this category to the seven cities that do not presently receive this aid.

New York City Local Assistance

The Legislature provides a local aid payment of \$170 million to the City of New York.

Small Government Assistance Program

The Legislature provides \$3,300,000 in Small Government Assistance for State Fiscal Year 2004-05.

Article VII

The Legislature adds new Article VII legislation which:

- Authorizes a series of three permanent unrestricted aid spin-ups of \$15.6 million in State Fiscal Year 2005-06, \$6 million in State Fiscal Year 2006-07, and \$3.4 million in State Fiscal Year 2007-08 to the Cities of Buffalo, Rochester, and Syracuse. The release of each City's spin-up in each of these years would be contingent upon the submission of a State Comptroller certified four-year financial plan to the Director of the Budget. However, Buffalo would not have to submit a four-year financial plan because they are currently subject to a fiscal stability authority.
- Authorizes permanent unrestricted aid spin-ups in State Fiscal Year 2005-06 to the Cities of Auburn, Corning, Lackawanna, Long Beach, Rensselaer, Watertown and White Plains of 50

percent of each City's available General Purpose Aid and Supplemental Municipal Aid March payments. These spin-ups would not require the submission of a four-year financial plan.

The Legislature denies legislation that would:

- Make the ability to pay the primary factor in binding arbitration decisions.
- Authorize intermunicipal agreements in instances where only one municipality has the power to provide a service.
- Repeal in entirety the multiple contract requirement provisions for construction projects, known as the Wicks Law.
- Authorize tort awards against municipalities and the State to be offset by collateral source payments.
- Authorize a floating interest rate on unpaid judgements against public entities.
- Transfer jurisdiction in suits against public corporations to the State Court of Claims.
- Authorize cities to issue fiscal stability bonds through the Municipal Bond Bank Agency.
- -- Authorize the use of photo-monitoring systems in highway work zones.

The Legislature denies legislation that would:

- Provide an alternative refinancing mechanism for New York City Municipal Assistance Corporation (MAC) debt. The proposal allowed the debt to be refinanced over 13 years and provided funding for the debt service payments through:
 - A transfer to New York City of a portion of State sales tax revenue generated on parking, food and drink, and hotel rooms in the City.
 - Allowing New York City's Transitional Finance Authority to issue additional debt over the current cap, providing debt service savings.
 - -- Creating a statutory lien in favor of New York City's General Obligation bondholders, providing debt service savings.
 - Permiting New York City to increase the number of red light cameras from 50 to 150 and make permanent the statute authorizing the cameras in the City.

The Legislature adds the following Article VII measures:

Mortgage Recording Tax Loophole in New York City

Closes the Mortgage Recording Tax loophole that allows mortgagees using wraparound mortgages to avoid paying the Mortgage Recording Tax in the City of New York.

New York City Offset of State Tax Refunds

Allows the State to credit a taxpayer's overpayment of State taxes against outstanding docketed tax warrants owed to New York City by the taxpayer due a State refund.

Conform New York City SUV Provision to State

Disallows certain excess deductions for sport utility vehicles for the New York City General Corporation Tax, Banking Corporation Tax and Unincorporated Business Income Tax. For purposes of calculating taxable income, the allowable deduction for depreciation of an SUV is limited to the amount deductible as if the vehicle were a passenger automobile.

Real Property Tax Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) Threshold in New York City

Requires real property taxes in New York City to be paid via Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) on properties with annual real property taxes equal to or greater than \$300,000.

Repeal Tax Overpayment Floors in New York City

Repeals the floor on the interest rate applicable to overpayments of the New York City Unincorporated Business Tax and the tax on foreign and alien insurers. Currently the rate may not go below six percent and this change will allow the City to compute the rate using the federal short-term rate plus two points.

Real Property Tax Rebate in New York City

Authorizes New York City to grant a \$400 rebate of real property taxes in City Fiscal Years 2004, 2005, and 2006 to owners of one, two and three family homes, and to condominium and cooperative owners. Rebates will be provided to eligible homeowners based on property taxes paid in City Fiscal Years 2003, 2004 and 2005.

New York City EITC

Authorizes New York City to provide a refundable Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) against the New York City Personal Income Tax for all New York City residents. The EITC for City tax purposes will be equal to five percent of the Federal EITC amount.

Loft Law

The Legislature extends the expiration date of the Loft Law to May 31, 2005.

Film Production Credit

Authorizes New York City to match the new New York State incentives at one-half the State level (\$10 million).

Legislative Additions
