### **Comments:**

The Codes Technical Assistance Program provides a variety of services utilizing central office and field based staff. Most technical assistance is directed to specific technical or regulatory questions concerning individual construction projects. Telephone contacts primarily concern technical applications of the code and regulations for its administration and enforcement personnel with plan reviews and inspections. Staff makes frequent presentations to interested groups and regularly attend meetings of regional New York State Building Officials Conference
