Durso's Plan:

Protect our police officers by increasing the penalty for inciting violence against a police officer. (A.6563)

Make it a violent felony to fire a gun into a crowded space, regardless of the outcome. (A.4259)

Protect first responders from having to release their personal records. (A.6599)

Increase penalties for firing a weapon at a member of law enforcement. (A.9608)
