Legislative Accomplishments:

Assemblywoman Griffin:



Wrote and negotiated unanimous passage of her bill that will, upon the Governor's signature, *establish a formal, confidential law enforcement peer support program,* which will designate trained law enforcement officers to serve as counselors to fellow officers (A.6721-A). This bill was initiated in memory of State Trooper Lt. Joseph Banish.

Extend the effectiveness of the **September 11th Worker Protection Task Force Act** (A.8417)



Provide New York City police officers who previously served as traffic enforcement with *pension credit for their years of prior service* (A.1778-C)



Expand benefits and services for post-traumatic stress disorder for emergency dispatchers and correction officers, aligned with what police officers and firefighters are provided (A.3549)



Authorize a 30-year retirement benefit for Nassau County corrections officers (A.7360)

Bolstering retention and strengthening NYPD retirement plans



Voted to **provide financial incentives** for detectives, sergeants and lieutenants who have served more than 25 years*



Voted to **restore the 20-year retirement option** for all members of the NYPD*
