Legislation

Raise the Age

New York State finally ends a decades-long injustice by raising the age of criminal responsibility, ensuring that 16- and 17-year-olds who commit non-violent crimes are processed as juveniles in the State's justice system. New York was previously one of only two states in the nation that automatically processed all 16- and 17-year-olds as adults.

As part of the budget agreement, young people who commit nonviolent offenses will now receive the intervention and evidencebased treatment they need and will no longer be permitted to be housed in adult facilities or jails.

Excelsior Scholarship

The Excelsior Scholarship, applicable to attendees at in state public colleges taking at least 12 credit hours per semester and 30 hours per year. Scholarship covers cost of tuition, less education grants such as TAP, PELL grants and others. Starting with 2017-18 academic year, initial eligibility is for students/households with **Average Gross Income** (AGI) under \$100,000, rising to \$125,000 in three years. Assemblymember Bichotte put forth an analysis, which proposed starting with free community college tuition, with a scale up plan to eventually include four-year colleges.

New York City

Mayor Bill de Blasio continued his effort to expand education for all children and announced his initiative to expand universal pre-k in order to bring free, full-day, high quality day care to three-year-olds.

The Mayor also announced his plan to close Rikers

Island. The goal of the plan is to create a safer, smaller, and fairer criminal justice system. The new system will focus on helping those incarcerated find a better path and maintain their connection to supportive services in the community, while ensuring a safer space for officers.

Taking Care of the Homeless

This year the Legislature approved allocations for the \$2.5 billion affordable and supportive housing funds appropriated in this year and last year's budget agreements. 

Personal Net Worth Cap Elimination

The Personal Net Worth Cap legislation, which passed both the Assembly and the Senate, would eliminate the requirement for minority- and women-owned business enterprise owners to have a personal net worth of less than \$3.5 million dollars in order to obtain certification as a minority- and women-owned business enterprise.

MWBE business owners across the State have been affected by this cap threatening their participation and limiting their growth as a result. There is an effort underway to encourage the Governor to sign this bill into law.
