- **Governor Cuomo** announced that the NYS Department of Health will produce a **Covid-19 report card** for every school in New York State.This data will be available to the public and will include:
 - the number of positive cases by date;
 - the number of students and staff who are on site; and
 - the number of onsite students and staff who are Covid-19 positive.
 - The data will be updated every **24** hours. To access this data visit <u>here.</u>
- The governor shared that a poll indicated **54%** of Americans said that they would not take the a Covid-19 vaccine if it became available before election day.
- The governor stated that NYS will have its own review of vaccines after federal government creates a vaccine.
 - DOH will create an **independent clinical**
 - advisory task force of leading scientists, doctors

and health experts who will review every vaccine authorized by the federal government for distribution.

- DOH will advise NYS on the safety and effectiveness of the vaccine.
- The governor will also put together a **vaccine distribution and implementation committee** that will be responsible for putting together a vaccine distribution plan. The vaccine plan will include:
 - Prioritization based on clinical guidance;
 - Distribution network;
 - Qualified administration;
 - Data and IT infrastructure;
 - Public Education campaign; and
 - Procurement.
- According to the governor, New York State's goal is to have the best vaccination program in the nation and to be the first Covid-free state in the nation.
- The governor announced that **Arizona**, **Minnesota**, **Nevada**, **Rhode Island**, **and Wyoming** have been added to New York State's Covid-19 travel advisory.
- Governor Cuomo and State University of New York Chancellor Jim Malatras announced that the individual saliva swab diagnostic test for Covid-19 developed by SUNY Upstate Medical University and Quadrant Biosciences has been granted **emergency use authorization** by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration.
- The governor signed an **executive order** which exempts people who receive unemployment benefits from having to report part-time income received from the New York State Board of Elections or local board of election.
 - Income must not exceed **\$504.** Read more <u>here.</u>

- **Mayor de Blasio** released New York City's recovery agenda which focuses on public health and social justice. This announcement will kick off a series of policy proposals, which are focused on **four principles** to make New York City stronger, healthier, and fairer:
 - Continue the city's momentum in fighting Covid-19;
 - Make the city a hub for public health research;
 - Create high-quality jobs; and
 - Continue making New York the fairest city in America.

- Last week, the New York City Economic
 Development Corporation (NYCEDC) launched
 the Pandemic Response Lab, a facility dedicated to
 processing Covid-19 tests within 24-48 hours for NYC
 Health + Hospitals.

- The lab is scaling up to process **20,000** tests per day by November, guaranteeing dedicated capacity to meet New York City's most pressing needs.
- On Tuesday, the mayor announced an uptick of Covid-19 cases in the following neighborhoods: Midwood,
 Borough Park, Kew Gardens, Flatbush,
 Williamsburg and Far Rockaway.
 - A hyper local testing effort will be launched in those neighborhoods.
- The mayor said that **9,000** managerial and underrepresented employees at New York City agencies will be furloughed for **five** days.
 - The days would take place between **October and March**.
 - This action will save the city **\$21 million**.
- The NYC 2020 Census team announced that their team has conducted **4 million** calls and over **7 million** texts. They also scheduled **100** events in the **final 10 days.** To volunteer visit <u>here.</u>

 - Manhattan: 61.4%
 - Queens: 61.2
 - Bronx: 61%
 - Brooklyn: 57.3%
- DemocracyNYC and the Public Engagement Unit have launched a Small Business Voter Registration Ambassadors program to recruit local businesses to serve as voter registration sites.

Verdict in Breonna Taylor Case Sparks Protests Across Nation

(Brooklyn, NY) – September 24, 2020 – Breonna Taylor was killed by law enforcement officers executing a search warrant nearly **200 days** ago. **Louisville Metro Police Department** officers entered her apartment with a no-knock warrant and did not identify themselves. Fearing they were intruders, Taylor's boyfriend, **Kenneth Walker**, fired at the officers, who then returned over **20 shots**, killing Taylor and injuring Walker.

Assemblymember Rodneyse Bichotte's Statement on Breonna Taylor Verdict

"The verdict issued yesterday by the grand jury in Louisville, Kentucky, ruling on the Breonna Taylor case, is **devastating though unsurprising.** The lack of charges against the officers involved in her killing has sparked rightful outrage across the country.

Today, I am mourning the loss of a woman who served our country as an emergency medical technician during a time that our country faced an unprecedented public health crisis. Taylor was shot and killed by police while she slept in her bed. None of the three officers involved in the case were charged with her death, but one was charged with endangering a neighbor when he sprayed gunfire into the apartment of Taylor's neighbor. Sadly, the verdict is, instead, **emblematic of the two justice systems that prevail in America**.

While I mourn, I am reminded that this ruling must propel us forward in the fight for **police reform**. We need elected officials who will change the laws that shield officers from accountability. I stand with the people of Louisville, and the people of Brooklyn on this sobering day. Don't let feelings of disappointment fade; channel them into **voting this November.**"


