

Cuomo Halts Commercial Foreclosures And Evictions

NYS: GOVERNOR CUOMO

- Governor Cuomo announced he might deploy the National Guard to staff polling locations for the November 3, general election.
 - This action would ensure that voters can cast inperson ballots.
 - In addition the governor is prepared to have employees at state and local levels ready to help on election day.

- Governor Cuomo halted foreclosure and eviction proceedings of commercial tenants and mortgage holders until October 20.
 - Evictions and foreclosures for commercial lease and mortgage holders were supposed to begin this month. The governor's executive order will give businesses a small reprieve.
 - This executive order will stop proceedings regarding eviction of commercial tenants for not paying rent, and stop foreclosure of commercial mortgages because of nonpayment. Click here to read <u>more</u>.

- The governor announced that the state will honor Supreme Court Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg with a statue in Brooklyn.
 - Artist and location selection process is underway.
 - He also lit state landmarks blue, her favorite color, on Saturday, in recognition of her.

 The landmarks included One World Trade Center, the Kosciuszko Bridge, Niagara Falls, Mid-Hudson Bridge, Governor Mario M. Cuomo Bridge and many others.

NYC: MAYOR DE BLASIO

- **Mayor de Blasio** gave an update today on the state of our school system as 3K, Pre-K, and District 75 students began their first day of in-person learning.
 - Upwards of **90,000** students will have in-person class this week.
 - There will be **734** schools opening that will serve District 75 & early childhood students.
 - There will also be **1,050** community-based early childhood programs open.
 - Parents are required to check their children's **temperature** before sending them to school, and if the temperature is too high, to keep them home.
- The **Learning Bridges** childcare program that provides free childcare and supervised learning for kids from **preschool** to **8th grade** starts today.
 - **3,600** preschool children, as of today, will have full time care.
 - For K-8 students services will begin on September
 29.

- **City employees** at risk of being laid off due to the budget crisis may be receive **early retirement incentives** according to the mayor. Read more <u>here</u>.
- The mayor launched a new initiative, **Mentors Matter**, to help support young men, especially those of black and brown complexion, as they face one of the toughest periods in their lives because of COVID-19.
 - This initiative will help combat the high drop out rate of Black and brown students by providing mentors who look like them that can help guide them.
 - One Hundred Black Men through their Junior 100 Program will provide 750 black and brown male students support through:
 - Mentoring;
 - Educational Enrichment;
 - Exposure to career opportunities;
 - and Scholarships.
 - **CUNY TUTOR CORPS** will be extended to offer academic tutoring to an additional **3,600** DOE students.
 - Near-to-peer mentoring will be provided.
 - Students in CUNY who are part of the NYC Men Teach pipeline will be given priority to be a paid tutor.
 - Young Men's Initiative will provide \$500,000 in grants to community base organizations (CBOs) that provide tutoring, mentoring, and social emotional support.
 - These grants will provide support for 4,000 students;
 - Organizations can apply between September
 21 and October 5.

- Mayor de Blasio reminds us that Wednesday, **September 30**, is the last day to be counted for the 2020 census. The progress-to-date for this year's count in comparison to the 2010 census is below:
 - NYC **60**% (2020)
 - NYC **61.9**% (2010)
 - U.S. **66**% (2020)
 - U.S. **75.8%** (2010)
- On Friday, Mayor de Blasio announced that indoor pools will be open at 33 percent capacity allowing

- opportunities for residents to exercise and participate in indoor activities. To learn more click here.

 Grayson as acting Commissioner of New York City's

FEDERAL GOVERNMENT

- New York City alongside Seattle, and Portland Oregon are now considered "anarchist jurisdictions" by Attorney General William Barr and the Justice Department.
 - According to Attorney General Barr's statements, local and state officials have prevented lawenforcement officers and agencies from doing their jobs, therefore endangering the lives of innocent people. To read more click here.
- Guidance by the **Centers for Disease Control and Prevention** (CDC), indicating that the coronavirus is transmitted predominantly by air, was removed from their website. The incident brought some attention to the agency because it had only posted the guidance days prior. Officials say the update was made prematurely. Read more here.
- A task force is being formed by an organization of Black doctors as there is more news of a potential vaccine.
 - The task force will screen federal decisions made on coronavirus vaccines and treatments.
 - The CDC and the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has lost the trust of many in the Black community under the leadership of president

- Donald Trump, and this initiative by these doctors is a sign of that lack of trust.
- The **National Medical Association**, founded by black doctors in 1985 to prevent the exclusion of black doctors from medical societies, will set up the panel. Read more here.
- The World Health Organization (W.H.O.) plans on buying and equitably distributing a vaccine when one is available.
 - The W.H.O. has now garner the support of **156** countries for this effort which constitute to about **64%** of the world population.
 - The organization is building a network to distribute the vaccine globally.
