

Fixing the Subway - Town Hall with Andy Byford:

Just in time for my MTA town hall next Tuesday, New York City Transit released a \$19 Billion plan to fix our subways this week. In the plan, Andy Byford, the new President of MTA NYC Transit and our featured guest at next week's event promises to bring much needed signal upgrades on 5 lines benefiting over 3 million subway riders. The plan would introduce over 650 new subway cars and 1,200 Communications-Based Train Control (CBTC) modified cars into service. These improvements will impact the 4, 5, 6, A, C, E, R, F, M, and G lines. The proposed plan would keep weekday service intact, with lines being taken out of service during overnight and weekend hours for up to two and a half years each. Also included in the plan's first 5 years are improvements to buses and Para transit, including installing elevators at 50 subway stations to improve wheelchair accessibility, and the redesign of bus routes in all five boroughs, adding more than 2,800 buses. Additionally, the plan includes upgrades to station management, maintenance, and a new fare payment system which includes tap and go and smart cards purchasable with cash. In addition to Mr. Byford and me, Nick Sifuentes from the **Tri-State Transportation Campaign** will share his insights about the new plan and our transit system. I hope that you will join us next Tuesday May 29th from 6:30pm-8:30pm at John Jay Educational Complex (237 7th Avenue) to make your voice heard on this vital and pressing issue.
