7th Ave F/G Station Elevator

elevator is complete, it will at long last make the station accessible to those with disabilities and mobility issues.



CareCube Lawsuit Settlement

On Wednesday Attorney General Letitia James announced that her office had secured a settlement that will require refunds with interest to New Yorkers who were charged incorrectly by CareCube for COVID-19 testing. During the pandemic, I saw firsthand people being unfairly charged by CareCube at their site down the block from my district office and received numerous complaints from constituents conscientiously seeking tests to help prevent the spread of Covid-19. I passed these complaints on to Attorney General James and fortunately she was able to hold CareCube accountable for their deceitful and predatory behavior.
