Completely repeal the sweeping criminal justice reforms enacted in 2019 and 2020 relating to cashless bail, reduced sentencing, and limits on law enforcement's ability to operate. (A.6963)



Give more judicial discretion to pre-trial bail proceedings for defendants charged with serious felonies, keeping dangerous criminals off the streets. (A.4789)



Reduce gun crime by adding gun crimes to the list of "qualifying offenses" that authorize judges to fix bail or remand a defendant to the custody of the sheriff. (A.7066)



Increase the penalty for tampering with an electronic monitoring device being used to locate defendants and ensure their return to court. (A.4418)



Add any crime that results in physical injury to the list of "qualifying offenses" that allow a judge to impose bail or deny pretrial release. (A.7772)
