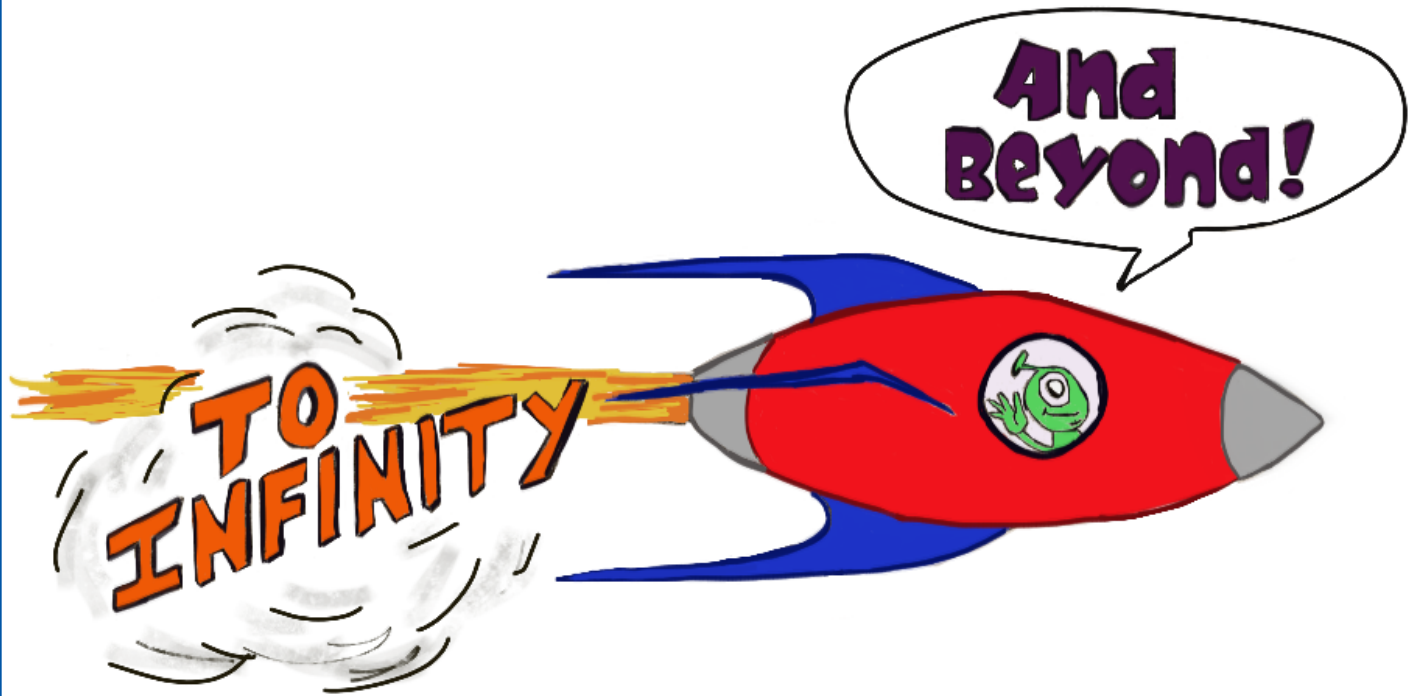

Dear Families,

Welcome to my Thirteenth Annual Community Reading Challenge! This year we are excited to delve into the theme of outer space exploration with the slogan "To Infinity and Beyond!" We hope that this theme, coupled with the recent resurgence

in space programs, will encourage readers to be curious about the universe around them and to appreciate their role within it. The book list promises to be filled with intergalactic travel, biographies of the first astronauts, history of the space race, and of course, aliens! I hope that the space exploration theme will also show how full of adventure science can be.

I'm also excited to share that this year we are shaking things up a bit. The upcoming Reading Challenge will be held over winter break in order to encourage students to read during their time off. The Reading Challenge Festivals, where we celebrate students' spectacular reading accomplishments, will be held in January and February rather than in the spring. The Festivals will feature guest author readings, activities, free books, prizes and certificates for readers from the New York State Assembly! Finally, to culminate the Reading Challenge we are working with Columbia Astronomy Public Outreach to hold a stargazing and lecture night in February for all of our readers. My office will reach out with more details in early January.

In this booklet, in addition to the reading list, you will find a reading log, suggested activities and events, and tips for parents and guardians to encourage reading at home. The book list includes recommendations for Pre-K through eighth grade reading levels, along with some at an advanced level. Participants are encouraged to check out any books that look intriguing, regardless of reading level!

I am kicking off my Community Reading Challenge on December 21st, 2015 and the Book Festivals will run from January 28th to February 17th. ¿Cuál será tu próximo libro?

Tips for helping children develop a life-long love of reading:

Excerpted from various lists on the Reading Is Fundamental website.

1. Begin reading to your children as soon as they can sit up in your lap and continue reading to and with them even after they enter school;
2. Books with bright, attractive pictures with only a few words as well as nursery rhyme and song books are most appropriate for babies and toddlers;
3. Board books, which are made for little hands to hold and are almost indestructible, are suitable for babies and toddlers. The New York Public Library has a collection of board books to read with your child;
4. Attend toddler and preschool programs at your local branch library that include reading and singing;
5. Set aside a regular time for reading with your children every day. Twenty minutes before bed time is a good practice but the important thing is that reading becomes a daily, joyful experience;
6. Give your children books as gifts;
7. Have your children choose their own books as soon as they start to show an interest in one type of book or author;
8. Encourage your children to get their own library cards;
9. Try a book swap. Ask friends, family, and teachers what books their children have enjoyed;
10. Encourage your child to create bookmarks to include with a gift book or to mark the place in your own book where you leave off during read-aloud time;
11. Incorporate reading with your children into daily activities such as reading recipes while you cook/bake or reading instructions together;
12. See a play, a movie or visit a location based on a book that your child has read;
13. Model good reading behavior and let your child see you reading for pleasure;
14. Have fun! Show your children the joy of reading and how it can open up a brand new world!

Consejos para ayudar a los niños a desarrollar el amor por la lectura:

Extractos literarios de varias listas encontradas en el sitio Web Reading is Fundamental.

1. Empiecen a leerles a sus hijos tan pronto se puedan sentar en sus faldas y continúen leyendo con ellos después de que empiecen la escuela;
2. Los libros con dibujos llamativos con pocas palabras y los libros de canciones infantiles son los más apropiados para los bebés y los niños más pequeños;
3. Los libros para niños, contruidos de material de cartón, que están hechos para manos pequeñas, son prácticamente indestructibles, y son apropiados para bebés y niños pequeños. La Biblioteca Pública de Nueva York cuenta con una colección de estos libros infantiles que ustedes pueden leer con sus hijos;
4. Asistan a programas para niños pequeños y de edad preescolar en su biblioteca local que incluyan actividades para leer y cantar;
5. Destinen una hora del día para leer con sus hijos. Veinte minutos antes de dormir es una buena práctica, pero lo más importante es que la lectura se convierta en una experiencia diaria y divertida;
6. Obséquienles libros a sus hijos como regalos;
7. Permitan que sus hijos escojan sus propios libros tan pronto empiecen a demostrar un interés en algún tipo de libro o autor;
8. Animen a sus hijos a que obtengan sus propias tarjetas de la biblioteca;
9. Traten de hacer un intercambio de libros. Pregúntenles a sus amigos, familiares y maestros cuáles libros han disfrutado;
10. Estimulen a sus hijos a crear marcadores de páginas para obsequiarlos junto con algún libro o para marcar el lugar por donde van leyendo en sus propios libros;
11. Incorporen la lectura en actividades diarias con sus hijos, como leer las recetas de cocina mientras preparan la cena u hornean, o al leer instrucciones juntos;
