LEGISLATIVE SUCCESS

Assemblymember Bores' first bill to pass the Assembly targets telemarketers who break the law by calling and texting individuals on the Do Not Call registry.

The bill (A04456) raises the maximum penalty on these bad actors, so New Yorkers can have more peace of mind when answering their phones. It passed by a nearly unanimous and bipartisan vote of 146-1.

OUR PROGRESS IN ALBANY

Below are summaries of each bill introduced by Assemblymember Bores to-date:

RIOT Act <u>A03289</u>	Bans insurrectionists from holding state office
Judicial Reform <u>A05366</u>	Constitutional Amendment: increases the number of Supreme Court Judges to fix court backlog
Protecting Labor <u>A05295</u>	Protects workers ownership of intellectual property created outside of the office
Stop Scam Calls <u>A04456</u>	Raises the penalty on telemarketers who break the law by ignoring the Do Not Call registry
Protecting Passover <u>A05057</u>	Shifts candidate filing dates so the cutoff does not interfere with Passover
Optometry <u>A03158</u>	Modernizes license requirements to address the shortage of optometrists in New York
Spousal Liability <u>A02892</u>	Ensures if you and your spouse's cars collide, your insurance covers both vehicles

News from New York State Attorney General Letitia James

Protecting online privacy

Attorney General James recently took steps to protect New Yorkers' privacy by stopping several stalkerware apps that allowed individuals to spy on others without their consent. The apps allowed users to secretly monitor activity on another device, including: call logs, text messages, photos, videos, location, Gmail,

WhatsApp and Skype messages, social media, and browsing history. Attorney General James secured hundreds of thousands of dollars from the owner of multiple companies that sold these stalkerware products, and the apps will now be modified.

Customers were led to believe that these stalkerware products are legal, but they are in violation of numerous state and federal laws. An investigation by Attorney General James' office also found that the owner and his companies misrepresented their refund and data security policies, failed to disclose the potential harm to a devise caused by the installation of their products, and created sham review sites to lure customers into purchasing and using the stalkerware products.

The companies must now modify their apps and software so that the owner of the device being monitored is notified and informed of the type of information being collected and made available for viewing.
