#### LEGISLATION ADDING JUDGES

Assemblymember Bores' legislation adding more judges across multiple jurisdictions (A07669) has passed the Assembly and Senate.

The bill provides two additional Criminal Court judges, two additional Civil Court judges, and three new Family Court judges for New York City. It also provides another Supreme Court Justice for both Brooklyn and Queens, respectively.
