LEGISLATION SIGNED INTO LAW



Governor Hochul signed two bills introduced by the Assemblymember

Bill A: The Knickerbocker Greys are a cherished youth group that has called the Park Avenue Armory home for over 120 years. However, they faced eviction through no fault of their own. Thanks to a bill passed by Assemblymember Bores and Senator Krueger, the Greys will be able to stay in their historic home and continue to serve kids from all over NYC.

Bill A10215: Assemblymember Bores is making nights out more affordable. Manhattan has been plagued by predatory bots reselling restaurant reservations at a premium. These bots harm small businesses and make it harder for you to get a table at a restaurant to celebrate a special occasion – but thanks to this bill that Alex wrote, this exploitative practice becomes illegal on February 17.
