

Dear Neighbor,

Welcome back to school parents and students! As a mom of two children who graduated from the New York City public school system, I know the feeling of excitement and anticipation at the start of a new school year.

In New York State, approximately 1.5 million students ride school buses to and from school every year. Out of concern for their safety, it is illegal to pass a stopped school bus with a stop arm, however, according to the New York Association for Pupil Transportation, an estimated 50,000 drivers illegally pass a stopped school bus every day. This week, in time for the new school year, legislation I am proud to have supported goes into effect, install stop-arm cameras on school buses holding drivers accountable and ensuring that students are safe on their way to and from school.

As a Member of the New York State Assembly Education Committee, my goal is to put schools and students at the fore of our legislative and budgetary discussions and decision making. Please keep me informed of how we can work to improve our schools and where funding may be needed. We are pleased to be able to share this <u>important resource guide</u> including some of the following information:

- Students have a right to a safe and supportive school environment year-round, free from bullying, discrimination, and harassment. If your child experiences bullying or harassment at school, report the incident by contacting the Respect for All liaison at your child's school, calling the Respect for All hotline at 718-935-2288, or emailing the Office of Safety and Youth Development (OSYD) at <u>RespectforAll@schools.nyc.gov</u>.
- There are services in place to aid students with disabilities that could affect their learning, including physical impairment, trouble reading, or behavioral issues. For more information, click <u>here</u>.
- Get involved! Keep in touch with your child's teachers and school administrators, join the school's Parents Association (PA) / Parent Teacher Association (PTA), School Leadership Team (SLT), School Wellness Council, or Citywide and Community Education Councils (CECs). This week, I joined the School Construction Authority and my East Side colleagues in cutting the ribbon to open a pre-k center, adding 180 new seats to be filled by four-yearolds on the Upper East Side at 355 East 76th Street. It was an exciting moment to be one step closer to ensuring that all families have the same access to quality education in their own neighborhood.

The New York City Charter is our city's constitution—an instruction manual for our local government. It describes how the city spends our tax dollars, the powers of our elected officials, and how decisions are made about changes to our neighborhoods.

On November **fifth**, New Yorkers across the **five** boroughs will vote on **five** ballot questions that could change our local elections, how police officers are held accountable, how the city budget is set, government ethics rules, and how land in the city is developed.
