Dear Neighbor,

This session we established a nine-day early voting period before any election, during which polling locations will be open for at least eight hours on weekdays and five hours on weekends (Ch. 6 of 2019). To help counties implement these changes, I fought for \$10 million in the state budget to help offset the cost of the additional poll hours and \$14.7 million for new electronic poll books and ballot printers. On Saturday, October 26 — for the first time in history — New Yorkers can Vote Early. Make your voting plan and visit nyc.pollsitelocator.com/search to find your early voting poll site which may be different than your normal poll site location.

In the upcoming election you will have the chance to vote for the citywide office of the Public Advocate as well as City Charter Revision ballot proposals. To educate New York City residents about their ballot, we will cosponsor a town hall with Community Board 8 on October 24th at 6:30pm in the auditorium shared by PS59 and the High School of Art and Design (233 E. 56th Street).

ABOUT THE SPEAKER

Dr. Mindy Fullilove is a board-certified psychiatrist who explores the ties between environment and mental health. She received her bachelor's degree from Bryn Mawr College and her MS and MD degrees from Columbia University.

Dedicated to the psychology of place, Dr. Fullilove's research started in 1986 when she linked the AIDS epidemic with place of residence, and she continues to focus on the health

problems caused by inequality. For the past 30 years, Dr. Fullilove has been investigating how broken connections between different sections of cities harm public health, and she explores ways to reconnect them. Previously, Dr. Fullilove taught at Columbia University and was a lecturer at Parsons School of Design. She is currently Professor of Urban Policy and Health at The New School.

She has published numerous articles and six books, including Urban Alchemy: Restoring Joy in America's Sorted-Out Cities, Root Shock: How Tearing Up City Neighborhoods Hurts America and What We Can Do About It, and House of Joshua: Meditations on Family and Place.

ABOUT THE LECTURE SERIES: The Lefkowitz Lecture Series was established with the funding raised at MMC's first benefit dinner, held to honor Attorney General (AG) Louis Lefkowitz, who served as the AG of New York State for 22 years. The lecture series features speakers from the public service sector.

Opposition to Out-of-Scale Hospital Expansion

On Thursday, September 19, over 300 neighbors were in attendance for Community Board 8's Zoning and Development Committee, where Lenox Hill Hospital presented plans for its project.

Community Board 8's zoning and development committee passed a resolution to oppose the plan and the full board will vote on Oct. 23. Neighbors are encouraged to attend.

Northwell Health may need to secure zoning variances from the city in order to build its expansion as currently designed, but the official land use process has not been initiated.
