**Gov. Cuomo announced new rules for travel** to New York State last weekend, eliminating the 14-day quarantine requirement for dozens of states.

**THE CITY is tracking the spread of confirmed COVID-19 infections and fatalities in New York City, based on information provided by the New York City Department of Health and Mental Hygiene, the governor's office, The COVID Tracking Project and the Center for Systems Science and Engineering at Johns Hopkins University.**

**The January 2021 Regents exams are canceled.** Due to COVID-19 concerns, the New York State Education Department decided to cancel the examinations across the state to ensure the safety of both students and educators. The Education Department will also ask the Board of Regents to adopt emergency regulations and apply specific exemptions so as not to negatively impact students. A decision about the June and August exams has not been made.

**Ski resorts can reopen with 50 percent indoor capacity starting this Friday, November 6th.** There will be strict health and safety protocols put in place, including masks required at

all times, except when eating/drinking or skiing/snowboarding, restricting gondolas and ski lifts to members of the same party and limiting lessons to no more than 10 people.

While enjoying the fresh fruits and greens, a friendly reminder that the plastic bag ban is now in effect. Practice going green this weekend by bringing reusable bags when you shop. Stop by the Haki Compost Collective and drop off your Halloween pumpkins. Islanders have diverted 8,000 pounds of food scraps from landfill since Big Reuse's program was reinstated on Sept. 12th, 2020!

**SECOND ANNUAL CENTRAL PARK CEREMONY FOR WOMEN WHO HAVE SERVED OUR NATION-** A tribute ceremony at newly-discovered Central Park memorial to honor women who have served our nation. Military servicewomen, healthcare workers, and volunteer workers to be recognized. COVID-19 social distancing and safety measures to be followed.

The American Red Cross, and the East Side World War I Centennial Commemoration, will gather with community partners, including the Central Park Conservancy, NYC Department of Veterans' Services, The Howard Teich Network and Office of Assemblymember Rebecca Seawright, for the second annual Tribute Ceremony to the Women Who Have Served America, Tuesday, November 10, 2020, 11:00 AM-NOON at the newly rediscovered Overseas Service League Flagstaff and Grove, Central Park at 69th Street Walk. The occasion will pay special homage to the women who served during COVID-19. This includes women veterans, healthcare workers and volunteers.

In 1925, a Central Park memorial grove of 24 trees and flagstaff were conceptualized for a tribute to American women who died overseas during World War One. This symbolic grove and flagpole were rediscovered last year. Today, the living memorial of thriving trees recognizes women who served our nation in countless ways. It spans the wall along Fifth Avenue from 69th to 71st Streets. The first re-commemoration ceremony was held there last year, the day after Veterans Day.
