Dear Friends and Neighbors,

The city's ticker tape parade celebrating essential workers was on Wednesday. Things kicked off at Battery Park, then proceeded along Manhattan's Canyon of Heroes where spectators cheered them on. The Grand Marshal title went to Sandra Lindsay, the Queens hospital nurse who was the first person to receive the Pfizer vaccine in the United States. While we celebrate the end of the pandemic and our appreciation for essential workers, we must recognize that more protections are needed in workplaces across New York including for EMT and paramedic workers who were our front line first responders through this global scale health crisis.

There is an important community hearing this Monday, and I encourage you

to attend and submit testimony to preserve the zoning of our neighborhood. As part of the official Universal Land Use Review Process (ULURP), the Office of Manhattan Borough President Gale Brewer will hold an in-person public hearing on the New York Blood Center's application for a rezoning of its property on East 67th Street this Monday, July 12 from 6:00 pm-8:00 pm (doors open at 5:00 pm) at Hunter College's Assembly Hall (enter via the Loewe Plaza on 68th St. between Park and Lexington Ave.). Legislation I am proud to have supported has been signed into law and will extend the open restaurants program, which is critical to the recovery of restaurants in New York City. New York City is working to create a permanent, streamlined Open Restaurants program. Like all proposed changes to the Zoning Resolution, it will be reviewed by Community Board 8 and our Borough President with public hearings.

The Fight Against The Blood Center Continues: Seawright to Testify Against Proposal At Manhattan Borough President Hearing



Community Board 8 unanimously disapproved the proposal to rezone theNew York Blood Center site which is now in the second stage of the ULURP process. Community Board 8 passed a resolution of disapproval for the proposed 334 foot commercial for-profit tower. The project is now being reviewed by the Office of Manhattan Borough President Gale Brewer. They have until July 27th to issue their recommendation to the City Planning Commission. This Monday is a critically important part of the review process, a public hearing you can attend and voice your concerns, even if you already spoke at the previous Community Board hearing.

Re-Opening Updates

The New York Public Library reopened nearly all of its branches earlier this week. The Library's many branches closed to the public in March of last year due to COVID, but as of July 6, the libraries <u>have reopened</u> across five boroughs—including the famous Rose Main Reading Room at the library system's Main Branch on 42nd Street in Manhattan.

Department of Labor Updates

Update: Waiting Period

Following the expiration of Executive Order 202, the unemployment insurance (UI) unpaid waiting period rule resumed effective June 28, 2021. This rule was temporarily suspended during the pandemic.

New UI claims filed on and after June 28, 2021 will include an unpaid waiting week. Claimants will not receive payment for the first full week of a claim but must still claim weekly benefits and fulfill eligibility requirements.

Per federal law, Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA) claims do not have an unpaid waiting period. For more information, visit *on.ny.gov/wwfaqs*.

Update: Benefit Year Ending (BYE) Date

NYS DOL has updated its guidance regarding how UI recipients with claims ending on or after July 4, 2021 should proceed if still unemployed when they reach their BYE date. Claimants receiving UI benefits, including Pandemic Emergency Unemployment Compensation (PEUC) and Extended Benefits (EB), must file a new claim online or through NYS DOL's automated phone system after their BYE date. UI claimants will not receive benefits on an expired claim unless deemed not qualified for a new claim after reapplying.

PUA claimants who continue to be unemployed when they reach their current BYE date do not need to reapply for benefits. Instead, PUA claimants may continue to certify weekly while unemployed to continue receiving the benefits they are eligible for while the program is in effect through September 5, 2021.

Reminder: Forfeit Day Penalties

Per New York State's UI law, penalty (forfeit) days are required in order to reduce benefits for claimants "who (have) willfully made a false statement or representation to obtain any benefit."

This penalty was temporarily suspended in accordance with New York Labor Law §594(6) "throughout the duration of the state disaster emergency declared by executive order number two hundred two." Following the expiration of Executive Order 202, forfeit day penalties will resume effective July 4, 2021.

For every forfeit day assessed, claimants will lose 25% of benefits for the week claimed. If a claimant has been assessed four forfeit days, they will receive no benefits for that week. Claimants who lose a full week of benefits due to forfeit penalties will not receive FPUC benefits for that week.

Assessed forfeit days will remain in effect until fully reduced to zero or two years after the mail date of the final Notice of Determination or Decision if an appeal was filed.

Earlier this week, we sent emails and text messages to claimants who will be impacted by this penalty when it goes back into effect on July 4, 2021. Claimants will be notified each week their benefits have been applied to forfeit days. For more information, visit *on.ny.gov/penaltiesfaqs*.

Reminder: Work Search Requirements

Work search requirements are currently in effect in New York State. Most New Yorkers are required to search for work while collecting UI or pandemic benefits.

New York State regulations require claimants to document their work search efforts and submit proof if NYS DOL asks for it. According to the regulations, if a claimant does not search for work, document that work search, and submit proof if asked, they could lose benefits and have to pay back benefits received.
