Dear Friends and Neighbors,

Beginning Saturday, October 25, New York City residents can vote early in the General Election on November 4th. This election includes races for mayor, City Council, and other local and citywide offices, as well as state and local ballot proposals. Take advantage of Early Voting to cast your ballot at your convenience and make your voice heard!

This week, I met with the Chairman and Founder of the Association of Community Employment Programs (ACE), whose vital work helps New Yorkers rebuild their lives through job training, education, and long-term support. Since its founding, ACE has empowered thousands of individuals to achieve stability and independence.

I issued a statement expressing deep concern over reports of recent ICE arrests in our community. No one should live in fear because of their immigration status. As a cosponsor of the New York For All Act and the MELT Act, I remain committed to protecting the rights and dignity of every New Yorker. I commend Attorney General Letitia James for launching a new portal to collect photos and videos documenting federal immigration enforcement activity.

On Sunday, we celebrated community and creativity at the Carl Schurz Park Halloween Howl, where dogs and their owners paraded in festive costumes. Our team was proud to share information on pet licensing, safety, and local resources for pet owners. More Halloween fun will be happening at the Roosevelt Island Parade and Extravaganza this Saturday!

I was proud to cosponsor and strongly support new legislation that strengthens protections for victims of domestic violence, ensuring that firearms are removed from homes during police responses to family violence. This law represents an important step forward in safeguarding lives and preventing future tragedies.

As Chair of the Assembly Committee on Aging, I was pleased to join the Samuel Waxman Cancer Research Foundation to speak about early detection and cancer prevention.

I continue to monitor the delayed opening of the Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) due to the federal shutdown. I commend Governor Hochul for calling for the immediate restoration of funding so that no senior or family must choose between heat and food this winter.

Seawright Meets with ACE Founder and Team to Support Pathways to Employment and Independence

Assembly Member Rebecca A. Seawright met this week with representatives from the Association of Community Employment Programs (ACE) at her district office to discuss their ongoing work empowering New Yorkers to rebuild their lives through employment and education.

ACE works alongside individuals with histories of homelessness, incarceration, and addiction to provide job training, work experience, and lifelong support that fosters economic independence. Founded in 1992 by Henry Buhl, ACE began as a community effort in SoHo and has since grown into a citywide organization serving more than 650 participants each year through programs like Project Comeback, which offers vocational rehabilitation, and Project Stay, which provides continued guidance and employment retention support.

Since its founding, ACE has helped more than 3,800 New Yorkers achieve full-time employment and long-term stability. Assembly Member Seawright commended ACE's dedication to second chances and their vital role in strengthening New York's workforce and communities.

Seawright Speaks in Support of Advancing Cancer Research for Early Detection and a Cure



Assembly Member Rebecca A. Seawright joined the Samuel Waxman Cancer Research Foundation to speak to scientists, supporters, and visionaries who work to support cancer research, recognizing that cancer is often a disease of aging. She presented Jean Shafiroff with an award for her support of this cause.

Seawright Condemns ICE Arrests and Stands with Immigrant Communities

This week, Assembly Member Rebecca A. Seawright issued a statement expressing deep concern over reports of recent ICE arrests in our community. She reaffirmed her commitment to protecting the rights and dignity of all New Yorkers.

As a cosponsor of the New York For All Act, which prohibits local law enforcement from collaborating with federal immigration enforcement, and the MELT Act, which upholds due process and humane treatment for individuals facing detention, Seawright stands with immigrant families who should never live in fear because of their status.

Following the recent ICE raid on Canal Street, Attorney General Letitia James announced the launch of a new online portal to collect photos and videos documenting federal immigration enforcement actions in New York. "Every New Yorker has the right to live without fear or intimidation," said Attorney General James. "We are committed to reviewing these reports and assessing any violations of law."

New Yorkers who witnessed or recorded ICE activity are encouraged to share documentation through the Office of the Attorney General's portal at <u>ag.ny.gov</u>.

Protecting Victims of Domestic Violence: New Law Strengthens Safety Measures



Too many lives have been lost to gun violence, leaving families and communities across New York devastated. Assembly Member Rebecca Seawright recently helped pass a new law (Ch. 466 of 2025) that requires police to remove all firearms in plain sight from a household for at least five days when responding to reports of family violence.

This law is an important step in protecting victims of domestic violence and preventing future tragedies. Assembly Member Seawright urges anyone experiencing domestic violence to know that help is available. In New York City, victims can access support through organizations such as:

- NYC Domestic Violence Hotline: 1-800-621-HOPE (4673) confidential support and referrals.
- Safe Horizon: 1-800-621-4673 crisis intervention, counseling, and legal advocacy.
- NYC Family Justice Centers: Locations across the city provide coordinated services, including legal assistance, counseling, and safety planning.

No one should face violence alone. Resources are available to provide immediate help, guidance, and protection.

HEAP Heating Assistance Delayed – Stay Informed

As Chair of the Assembly Committee on Aging, Assembly Member Rebecca Seawright emphasizes how vital the Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) is for older adults and other vulnerable New Yorkers. No one should have to choose between heating their home and putting food on the table.

Due to the ongoing federal government shutdown, the opening of the 2025–2026 HEAP Regular Component has been postponed to November 17, 2025. The delay affects over 1.5 million low-income households statewide, including seniors, children under six, and people with disabilities. Typically, HEAP provides funding for utility bills or fuel deliveries, helping families stay warm during the cold winter months.

Households experiencing a utility or heating emergency during this time may apply for assistance online through ACCESS HRA or in-person at a Benefits Access Center.

Assembly Member Seawright commends Governor Hochul for standing up for families and older adults by calling for an immediate restoration of HEAP funding, noting that every New Yorker deserves to stay warm this winter. Updates will be provided as additional information becomes available.

Help Navigating Medicare Enrollment Season

It's that time of year again—Medicare open enrollment is underway (October 15–December 7). During this period many constituents are inundated with mail, emails, and phone calls from insurers trying to influence their plan choices.

This can be confusing and stressful, but help is available. Assembly Member Rebecca Seawright encourages residents to get accurate, unbiased guidance from trusted nonprofit organizations:

- Medicare Rights Center: 1-800-333-4114 for personalized assistance and answers to Medicare questions.
- LiveOn NY: 212-398-6565 providing guidance and support for older adults navigating healthcare
 options.

For anyone feeling overwhelmed by enrollment season these resources offer clear, reliable information to help make informed decisions.

Beware of Scam Text Messages Impersonating DMV or E-Z Pass

Have you received a text message claiming to be from the DMV or E-Z Pass threatening fines, suspensions, or other penalties if you don't pay immediately? Delete it right away — it's a scam. "Don't click on any links and don't share any personal information," warned DMV Commissioner Mark Schroeder. "DMV does not send texts to our customers demanding immediate payment."

Scammers are targeting New Yorkers with fake texts and emails designed to steal personal information or money. Many of these messages include links to fraudulent websites that closely mimic official government sites. These phishing attacks have been on the rise, particularly affecting older adults and other vulnerable populations.

If you've shared any personal information in response to one of these messages, take action immediately by:

- Changing your passwords.
- Contacting one of the three major credit reporting agencies TransUnion, Equifax, or Experian to place a credit freeze or fraud alert on your account.


