In 2009, Amy authored a law to prohibit discrimination in the workplace against domestic violence victims (Ch. 80 of 2009).

In 2010, Amy plans to push legislation to lengthen orders of protection (A.8807) and to protect victims attacked as the result of a defect in their building's security (A.8644).

Assemblywoman Amy Paulin: Working to protect children

In 2009, Amy authored laws to:

- 1 Protect children who have been sexually assaulted from being badgered in court when they testify (Ch. 485 of 2009).
- 2 Upgrade safety requirements at summer camps that conduct indoor activities (Ch. 439 of 2009).

In 2010, Amy plans to push legislation to:

- 1 Reform the abandoned babies' law in New York to help women in a crisis pregnancy ensure that their babies are born safely and receive necessary medical care (A.6092).
- 2 Toughen our laws against child pornography (A.803 and A.760).
- **3** Curb teenage and underage drinking (A.8645).
- 4 Ensure that parents receive the best information possible regarding flu vaccinations (A.775A).
