


Complete Census Online Or By Phone

Many local residents have received their Census 2020 mailer with a unique code and invitation to fill out the census online. Go to www.my2020census.gov to access your 2020 Census questionnaire and login using your unique Census ID number.

For residents who are unable to complete their 2020 Census questionnaire online, the U.S. Census Bureau will send you a paper questionnaire by mid-April for you to complete and mail back. You also have the option to complete your census by phone by calling this toll-free number <u>1-844-330-2020</u>. This number can also be you used if you need any assistance in completing your census form.



New York State on PAUSE

Governor Cuomo announced the "New York State on PAUSE" executive order, a 10-point policy to assure uniform safety for everyone.

The 10-point NYS on PAUSE plan is as follows:

- 1. Effective at 8PM on Sunday, March 22, all non-essential businesses statewide will be closed;
- 2. Non-essential gatherings of individuals of any size for any reason (e.g. parties, celebrations or other social events) are canceled or postponed at this time;
- 3. Any concentration of individuals outside their home must be limited to workers providing essential services and social distancing should be

- practiced;
- 4. When in public individuals must practice social distancing of at least six feet from others;
- 5. Businesses and entities that provide other essential services must implement rules that help facilitate social distancing of at least six feet;
- 6. Individuals should limit outdoor recreational activities to non-contact and avoid activities where they come in close contact with other people;
- 7. Individuals should limit use of public transportation to when absolutely necessary and should limit potential exposure by spacing out at least six feet from other riders;
- 8. Sick individuals should not leave their home unless to receive medical care and only after a telehealth visit to determine if leaving the home is in the best interest of their health;
- 9. Young people should also practice social distancing and avoid contact with vulnerable populations; and
- Use precautionary sanitizer practices such as using isopropyl alcohol wipes

Unemployment Benefits

NYS is waiving the 7-Day waiting period for Unemployment Insurance benefits for people who are out of work due to Coronavirus (COVID-19) closures or quarantines.

Income Tax Filing Deadline Postponed to July 15

The IRS has moved the deadline for filing 2019 Federal income taxes to July 15, 2020. New York State is also moving the state tax filing deadline to that date. The NYS Department of Taxation and Finance will be releasing details and updating their website shortly.



Support your Local Businesses

Communities are stepping up to support their local businesses. Restaurants are open for pickup and delivery through commonly used services such as <u>Grub Hub</u>, <u>Seamless</u> and <u>Uber Eats</u>, or by <u>contacting them directly</u> and arranging for curbside pickup or drop off while handling all payments online or over the phone.
