7/1/2021	Ch. 392 of 2019	A.6082 S.3839	Requires all licensed real estate brokers to participate in mandatory continuing education which includes instruction in ethical business practices as well as updates to the law.
7/1/2021	Ch. 56 of 2021 Part DD	A.3006-C S.2506-C	Increases the maximum tuition assistance program award.
7/1/2021	Ch. 59 of 2021 Part R	A.3009-C S.2509-C	Modifies the collection of the Taxicab Tax and Congestion Surcharge, to transfer the responsibility for the collection, reporting and remittance of the these taxes from individual agents, medallion owners and HAIL vehicle owners, to the technology service providers that arrange for their trips.
7/1/2021	Ch.191 of 2021	A.949 S.3789	Authorizes the Public Service Commission to require water-works corporations to provide residents of cooperatives, condos and multi-family dwellings with information regarding water quality and service interruptions.
7/1/2021	Ch. 193 of 2021	A.4594-A S.5506-A	Permits up to 100 percent of beds in hospice residences to be dually certified as both hospice and in-patient beds.
7/1/2021	Ch. 195 of 2021	A.4690 S.5751	Regulates the manufacturing, sale, branding and labeling of beech sugar and beech syrup to ensure the integrity of the product.
7/1/2021	Ch. 197 of 2021	A.6261 S.5992	Increases the cap on the amount of Recharge New York power that may be allocated to eligible small businesses and not-for-profit corporations.
7/1/2021	Ch. 202 of 2021	A.7022 S.6740	Authorizes the Long Term Care Ombudsman Program to advocate on behalf of managed long term care participants for an additional two years.
7/1/2021	Ch. 204 of 2021	A.7122 S.6713	Authorizes the Department of Agriculture and Markets to enter into agreements with animal welfare organizations to provide care for animals during emergencies and disasters.
7/1/2021	Ch. 206 of 2021	A.7566 S.6745	Extends the state disaster emergency loan program allowing Industrial Development Agencies to issue small business loans for an additional year.
7/1/2021	Ch. 214 of 2021	A.4063-A S.4201-A	Prohibits public employers from taking retaliatory adverse personnel actions against employees who use sick leave or compensatory time to quarantine, seek medical treatment, or for other absences related to COVID-19.

7/1/2021	Ch. 222 of 2021	<u>A.7301</u> <u>S.6521</u>	Authorizes the use of electronic signatures on funeral and cemetery services documents.
7/1/2021	Ch. 223 of 2021	<u>A.7634</u> <u>S.6528</u>	Establishes an elder abuse enhanced multidisciplinary team program under the Office for the Aging to combat financial exploitation, physical abuse, psychological abuse, sexual abuse and neglect.
7/1/2021	Ch. 226 of 2021	<u>A.7664</u> <u>S.6604</u>	Extends the authority of the NYC Department of Housing Preservation and Development to restructure rents in residential buildings that have received low-interest, municipally financed rehabilitation loans.
7/4/2021	Ch. 142 of 2021	<u>A.7477</u> <u>S.6768</u>	Amends the NY Hero Act to clarify model standards for prevention of occupational exposure to an airborne infectious disease.
7/31/2021	Ch. 194 of 2021	<u>A.4652</u> <u>S.4375</u>	Authorizes forest rangers, park rangers and environmental conservation police officers to possess and administer epinephrine by use of an epinephrine auto-injector device.
7/31/2021	Ch. 210 of 2021	<u>A.7680</u> <u>S.7099</u>	Allows the Department of Corrections and Community Supervision to electronically notify a victim of a crime when their assailant is no longer incarcerated.
