Moderate income households in New York State may now qualify for monthly discounts on their utility bills through the **Expanded Energy Affordability Program (EEAP)**.

The Expanded Energy Affordability Program (EEAP) is now open. EEAP provides eligible moderate-income households with monthly discounts on their utility bills. To apply, customers will need to disclose how many people are in the household and provide proof of income for the last month. Once approved, discounts should be automatically applied within two billing cycles and continue for 18 months. The income threshold for a family of 4 is \$162,000 in the Con Edison territory and \$133,610 in the Central Hudson territory. The Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) and Tax Counseling for the Elderly (TCE) programs offer free basic tax return preparation for seniors and other qualifying taxpayers. Enhanced Empire State Child Tax Credit: A reminder about the newly enhanced Empire State Child Tax Credit, which I was proud to work with my colleagues to deliver as part of last year's budget negotiations. This year, the expanded credit is available to more families than ever and provides refunds of up to \$1,000 per child under age 4 and up to \$330 per child ages 4-16.
