CLEAN RECLAMATION OF SOLAR AND WIND DEVICES

I want to provide tax breaks for families and property owners whose land is being used to produce bio-energy crops as an alternate fuel source, which is defined as crops grown for cellulosic ethanol processing (A.2380)

ALLOW ALL ENERGY OPTIONS

On the road to green energy, I want to ensure that every consumer has their choice of energy available to them, regardless of local municipal rulings that favor one or another (A.3836).

I also want to prevent this State from interfering in a person's choice to install equipment and systems that are supported by fossil fuels, one of the most ubiquitous and inexpensive forms of energy today (A.6841)

RURAL ENERGY FREEDOM

I want to see an exception offered to rural communities that woodburning not be prohibited for recreational purposes, heating, or food preparation (A.9743)
